SUBJECT : Minutes of the LUMINARY 1C (LM131 Rev 1) Flight Software Readiness Review (FSRR) for the Apollo 13 mission

1. The LUMINARY 1C FSRR for the Apollo 13 mission was held on March 16, 1970, in building 2, room 966 in the morning and completed that afternoon in building 4, room 261. Mr. T. G. Price of the Flight Support Division (FSD) opened the meeting with a description of the agenda to be followed. The agenda is listed below along with the responsible organization for each presentation.

2. The first presentation was the erasable load status given by Mr. J. W. Jurgensen of FSD. There are two versions of the erasable load that are ready - one for LUMINARY 131 and one for LM131 Rev 1, depending on which flight program is flown. Two questions were raised. The altitude bias for the reasonability test for the LR may change but, at the present time, is set at 200 feet. Investigation is continuing. A discrepancy existed for the polarity of the LPD azimuth bias between an MIT/SDL memorandum and the correct value. The erasable memory load has the correct value.

3. The next presentation was given by Mr. J. R. Garman of FSD. Mr. Garman described the causes and effects of a computer cycle overload that is commonly referred to as TLOSS. Mr. Garman will write a memorandum describing the details of this presentation. The slides used for the presentation are included here as enclosure 1. Mr. Garman's conclusion was a recommendation to fly LM131 Rev 1.

4. The following presentation was given by Mr. R. A. Larson of MIT/SDL and consisted of a description of the Level 6 testing of both LUMINARY 131 and LM131 Rev 1 and finally a brief account of the outstanding anomalies. Mr. Larson also discussed what input to the LGC could cause TLOSS, what output of the LGC could cause TLOSS, and what actions could increase or decrease duty cycle. The slides from this presentation are enclosed as enclosures 2 and 3, respectively. Mr. Larson also recommended flying LM131 Rev 1. 5. Mr. S. Greene of GAC presented the results of the FMES/FCI testing. Mr. Greene stated that there were five outstanding Simulator Discrepancy Reports (SDR's) that are attributed to the software. Of the five, two are included in the official program notes for the Apollo 13 mission; one was decided not to be an anomaly by MIT/SDL, and GAC is to investigate further the remaining two. The content of Mr. Greene's presentation is enclosed as enclosure 4. Mr. Greene concluded that both LUMINARY 131 and LM131 Rev 1 are flight worthy.

6. Mr. F. Hughes of KSC then discussed the crew training status. He stated that the crew has flown numerous simulations and that they are ready regardless of whether LUMINARY 131 or LM131 Rev 1 is flown. He also said that the crew preference is LM131 Rev 1.

7. In conclusion, the opinion of all speakers at the meeting was that the LUMINARY 131 and LM131 Rev 1 rope configurations are both capable of flying the Apollo 13 mission and all preferred the LM131 Rev 1 rope configuration.

8. Action items assigned at the meeting and the responsible organizations are as follows.

a. Determine value of altitude bias for the altitude reasonability test for the erasable memory load - FSB

b. Clarify workaround procedures for Apollo 13 descent programs to eliminate TLOSS problems - FSB

c. Official transmittal of Apollo 13 LM deorbit procedures - MIT/SDL

d. Investigate further and provide additional data for the SDR's discussed at the FSRR (LM-LUM-90, LM-LUM-91, LM-LUM-94) - GAC

- 1. IN NEW (NO. 2) PROGRAM, ONCE SAFELY IN P66, NO ADVERSE BEHAVIOR POSSIBLE UP PAST 12 PERCENT. GRACEFUL DEGRADATION BEYOND 12 PERCENT.
