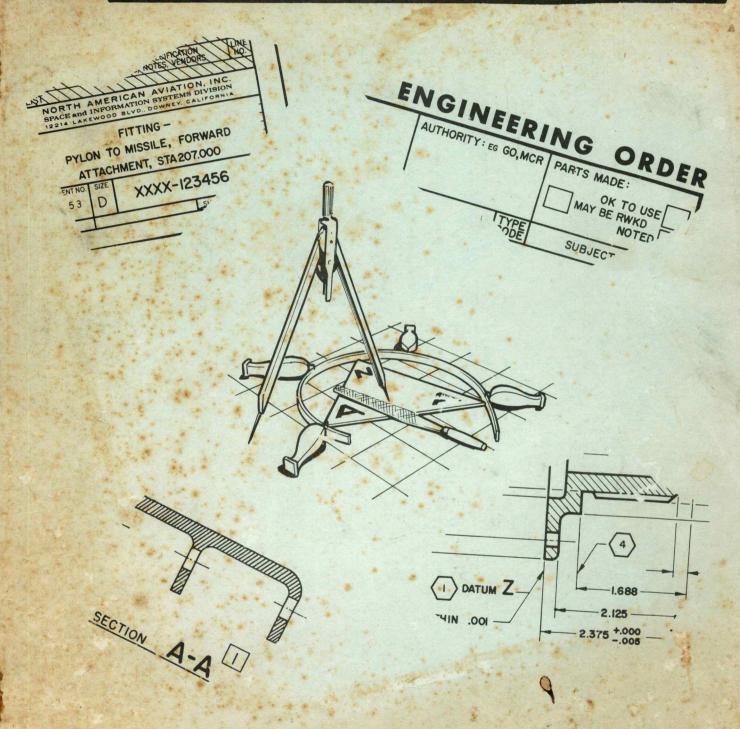
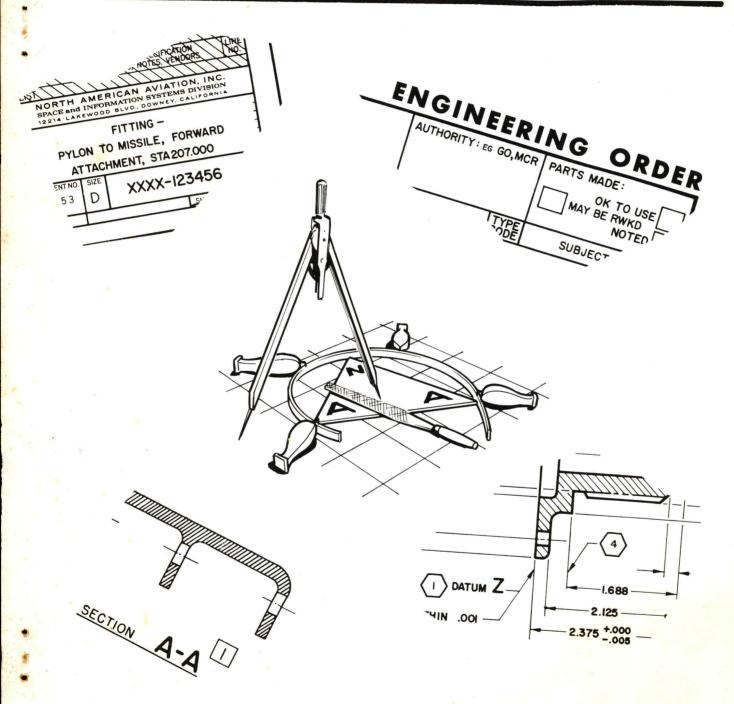

INTRODUCTION

Drawings function as the means of transmitting designs and data in graphic form from Engineering to Manufacturing, Inspection, and other concerned personnel. Consideration shall be given to the method of manufacture so that major parts or assemblies may be properly sequenced for fabrication and installation. Government contracts require that drawings be in accord with specific instructions relative to standard format and detailed preparation in order to be completely understandable by any other manufacturer. Large scale production of exact interchangeable parts requires that drawings be clear in presentation, accurate in dimension, complete in information, and subject to only one interpretation.

TITLE BLOCK

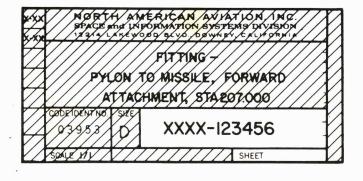
This course is presented in the same manner of sequence by which we read a Blueprint. Therefore, the Title Block will be studied first as this is where we find the drawing number, name, material used, and pertinent information.

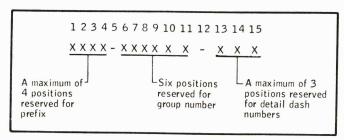
The drawing Title Block, located in the lower right-hand corner of each drawing, is preprinted on all production drawing vellums. It is divided into eleven main areas which contain pertinent information relative to the part, assembly or installation.

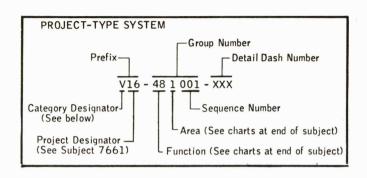
DRAWING NUMBERS

Production Drawing numbers are made up of three groups of numbers, separated by dashes. This number has a maximum of 15 positions with positions 5 and 12 reserved for dashes.





Two types of numbering systems are utilized. The Project Type System or the General Order System.



Production drawing numbers are assigned to all drawings except for special applications.

When applicable, the General Order will be assigned as the drawing prefix. Special prefixes will be used as applicable.

For project-type drawing prefixes, category designator letters have been assigned; as additional categories or projects are developed, they will be added.

The first three digits of the drawing numbers will be assigned in the appropriate group category for which the part was designed (regardless of where it assembles), and the last three digits are assigned serially in that group.

SPECIAL PREFIXES

The following paragraphs list those drawings which receive an alphabetical addition to the project or general order numbers as assigned, and although such drawings are not production drawings, their drawing or part numbers shall not exceed 15 positions.

Special test equipment tool drawings shall have a "TE" preceding the drawing numbers, e.g., TE9564-55096.

Guide master drawings shall have a letter "M" preceding the drawing number, e.g., MV16-541233.

Printed (or etched) circuit masters shall have a letter "M" preceding the drawing number, e.g., MG18-541234-XXX

"9" PREFIX TO GROUP NUMBER

The number "9" preceding the drawing group number is used to indicate special or unusual characteristics of certain types of drawings. The classes of drawings employing this designation are listed below.

Postcontract Proposal

Design Layout

Design Specification Control

Rework (NAA)

Substitution

Design Assembly and Installation Test

Hydra-Pneumatic Schematic

Electrical and Electronic Reference Drawings

The "9" group number shall be constructed in the following manner: the fourth or fifth digit of the group number shall be dropped and the number "9" shall precede the existing group numbers; thereby maintaining a six-digit number. For example, an assembly drawing for the Warhead Compartment would be numbered XXXX-312001 and the related schematic drawing would be numbered XXXX-931201.

The drawing classification or general order number will be assigned in the normal manner.

On such drawings the number "9" is used as an integral part of the drawing number, i.e., it is not set out by a dash or a space.

SPECIAL APPLICATION NUMBERS

Certain classifications of drawings have established prefixes and group numbers as noted in the following paragraphs.

Precontract and Post Contract Preliminary Layouts shall have a "PL" prefix followed by a special group number series as assigned by Preliminary Analysis, e.g., PL-1478.

Proposal Drawings made prior to the assignment of a General Order number shall have an "AD" prefix followed by a special group number series as assigned by Preliminary Analysis, e.g., AD-301.

Packaging Drawings shall have an "MK" prefix (except where previous contractual commitments or documention require the use of "DX" prefix), e.g., MK3XX-XXXXX.

Special Dimensional Tool Drawings shall be prefixed with a "T" followed by "-4" (for this Division) and a serial number as assigned by Tool Design, e.g., T-4-1042.

Specification Control Drawings are given a special series of definitive numbers by Central Specifications, e.g., ME195-0002

NAA Shapes Drawings (extrusions, machined, rolled, welded, etc.) are given the Corporate numbering system consisting of 15 position alphanumeric number, e.g., MSO43-1512-0001

NAA Design Standards Drawings (design practices, fastener installations, cutouts, lightening holes, "O"-ring groove dimensions, etc.) utilize the Corporate numbering system, e.g., MPO32-0001.

Corporate Standard Part Drawing numbers consist of a ten position alphanumeric number, e.g., MD123-0001.

Facilities Drawings shall have a "DF" prefix followed by a special group number series as assigned by the Number Assignment Clerk.

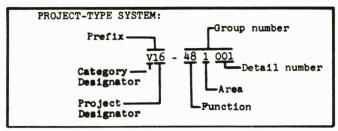
Fixture and Test Specimen Drawings shall be prefixed by "DTT" followed by the "1000" series group number as assigned serially by the Assignment Clerk, e.g., DTT-1016. Design Assembly Test and Design Installation Test Drawings will also be assigned a "DTT" number if they are not drawn to production configuration.

DRAWING NUMBER ASSIGNMENT

All new engineering drawings shall carry the assigned prefix followed by the six-digit group number selected from the applicable number chart. Drawings will be serially numbered by the Release Group in the normal manner.

PROJECT-TYPE SYSTEM

Project-type prefix drawing numbers are used on new programs, (Saturn, Apollo, Paraglider, etc.)



CURRENT DESIGNATION SYSTEM 1.

- End items, which do not have customer-assigned model 1.1 designations, are assigned company model designations by the Procedures Function of Engineering Data in accordance with the following instructions.
- 1.2 Company model designations consist of a category prefix letter and project designation number, a dash, and a serially assigned number to distinguish different items within a category, e.g., M3-1, A3-23, etc.
- The following categories and projects have been assigned; as additional categories or projects are developed, they will be added:

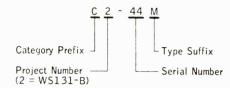

- 1.4 Additional dash numbers or letters will not be added to model designations.
- 1.5 Company model designations will not be changed to reflect changes in configurations unless the functional purpose of the end item is changed.

2. FORMER DESIGNATION SYSTEMS

- Prior to the adoption of the current system described at 2.1 paragraph 1 above, a similar system was utilized for support equipment; since this former system appears on many current drawings and documents, it is described herein as a matter of historical reference.
- 2.2 In the former system, the company model designation for research and development consisted of a category prefix letter and project number, a dash, a serially assigned number to distinguish different items, and a suffix letter (or letters) for the type of equipment, as shown in the following example:



Category Prefix	Type Suffix
A = Auxiliary	A = Automatic
C = Checkout	K = Kit
H = Handling	M = Manual
S = Servicing	T = Test

2.3 To distinguish between R&D and production contracts, a dash "A" was added to the model designation:

> C2-44M R&D Version C2-44M-A Production Version

2.4 Certain end items of support equipment, found in the following example, were assigned company model designations in a manner other than that described in paragraph 2.2.

PY-1 = Pylons

K2-1 = Nontactical Instrumentation System

MD-6 = Captive Ballast

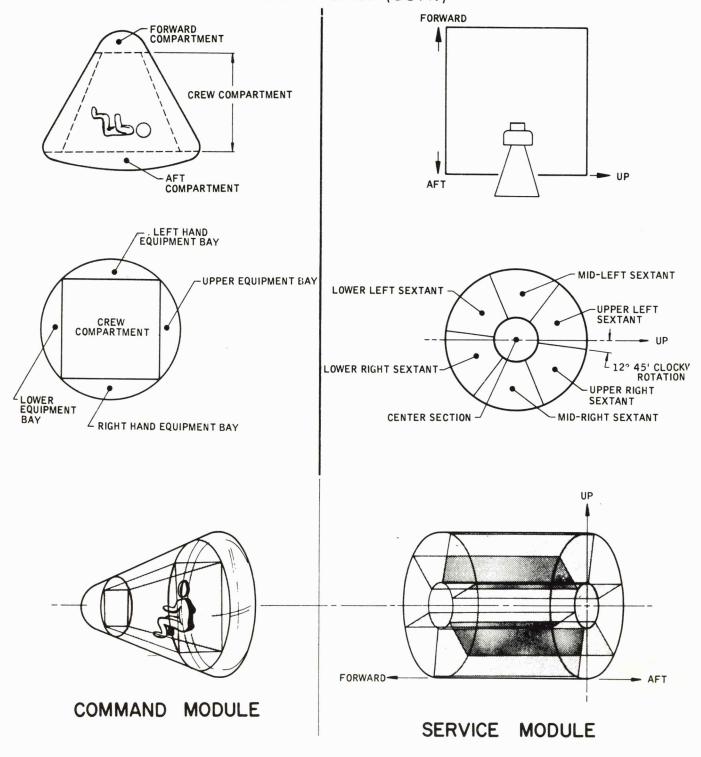

2.5 In certain cases, particularly in the R&D phase, additional dash numbers or letters were added to a model designation for different versions or usages of the same model; this practice is no longer being used.

NOTE: (1) The "area" or third digit of the Group Number is not applicable and shall be "O" in all drawing numbers.

DASH NUMBERS

Dash numbers are used to avoid preparation of separate drawings for every part or assembly. They are assigned to the drawing, as applicable, by the draftsman.

Odd dash numbers are always used for neutral parts or neutral assemblies; consecutive odd and even dash numbers are always for left hand and right hand parts or assemblies respectively.

Dash one (-1) and dash two (-2) respectively shall be used for left hand and right hand basic detail parts, and basic assemblies and installations only.

Dash numbers may be used as applicable for tabulated detail parts.

They shall not be used for springs, molded plastic parts, or purchased parts. Dash numbers shall not be used for machined parts, castings, or forgings, except as specifically described in other appropriate subjects.

Dash numbered details of assemblies or subassemblies, and dash numbered subassemblies shall not be called out on any other drawing. Left hand and right hand basic parts or assemblies (dash numbered -1 and -2), and tabulated dash numbered detail parts and assemblies, however, are called out on other drawings. When showing RH and LH dash numbers, it will be noted as follows: LH Shown RH Opposite or LH Shown RH Opposite and noted.

Component detail parts that are completely defined on an assembly drawing are assigned dash numbers -3, -5, -7, etc., for neutral and left hand details, and -4, -6, -8, etc., for corresponding right hand details.

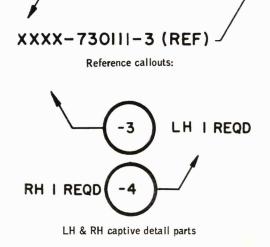
Component detail parts of permanent fusion-welded or brazed assemblies, including the machined parts and machined forgings, are assigned dash numbers similarly.

Permanent : semblies detailed on and included as subassemblies of a major assembly drawing shall be assigned two-digit dash numbers ending in the digit "1". Dash numbers -11, -21, -31, etc., are used for neutral and left hand subassemblies, and -12, -22, -32, etc., for corresponding right hand subassemblies. These two-digit dash numbers are not reserved for subassemblies only, but shall be used for details as well if available.

The different parts or assemblies of a tabulated drawing are assigned dash numbers -3, -5, -7, etc., for neutral and left hand details, and -11, -21, -31, etc., for neutral and left hand assemblies and -12, -22, -32, etc., for right hand assemblies.

Dash-numbered tabulated details or tabulated assemblies are always called out on other drawings. The use of each dash-numbered part or assembly of a tabulated drawing is shown in the Application (Usage) Data block.

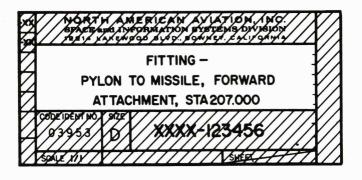

DRAWING TITLE BLOCK

The title is located in the title block in the lower right hand corner of the drawing. Title will be the name of the part plus assembly or installation (if applicable), followed by the group name of which it is a part, its position in the missile, and the description of the part.

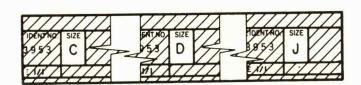

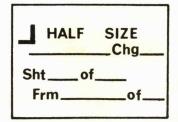

DRAWING SIZE BLOCK

Several types and sizes of vellums are used to clearly depict a part, assembly, installation, etc. Among these, the most commonly used are the standard cut-size and roll-size vellums. Two standard cut-size vellums are designated as "C", "D", and "J" sizes and have preprinted Title Block, Usage Block, Revision Block, and borders. For convenience in handling, many prints are reprinted as Blue Line Drawings one-half the size of the original prints. Such drawings carry a special seal located just above the Title Block.





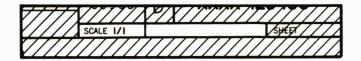
SCALE BLOCK

The scale to which the drawing is made will be indicated in the Scale space of the Title block by fractional method.

When the nature of a drawing is such that no scale can be used (i.e., wiring diagrams, schematics, isometrics, tabulated, and similar drawings) the word "NONE" will be placed in the Scale space.

When main drawing, and other views or sections differ in scale the word "NOTED" shall be placed in the Scale space in the Title block and the correct scale will be noted by each view or section.

Changes, additions, and corrections subsequent to the completion of the drawing may require that certain dimensions be shown out of scale. Such dimensions shall be indicated by a wavy underline, e.g., 500.



TOLERANCE BLOCK

Tolerances for decimal dimensions, angles, and holes noted "DRILL" are given in the Tolerance block. Tolerances which differ from those listed are noted on the drawing field or by a general note. The drill hole tolerance applies to holes that are specified as DRILL on the field of the drawing. Hole tolerances required to be different from those listed would be noted on the drawing field or by a general note and the term DRILL not used.

Tolerances are assumed to be applied to every dimension unless otherwise specified. When no tolerance or other indication appears on the field

of the drawing, the general tolerances in the drawing Title block shall apply.

Title block tolerances are \pm .03 for two-place decimals and \pm .010 for three-place decimals. These tolerances are preprinted on all drawing forms which show the full Title block.

All dimensions shall be expressed in the same number of places as the tolerance. Any tolerances other than those indicated shall be so noted preferably in line and directly with the dimension; and both dimensions and tolerances shall be in the same number of decimal places.

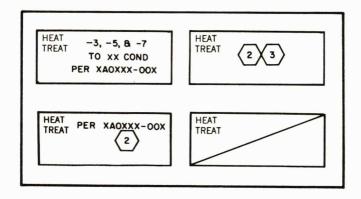

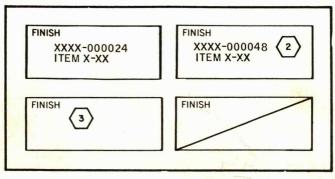
HEAT TREAT BLOCK

Heat treatment specified in this block shall be applicable to the part or individual parts of an assembly that may be given along with the appropriate specification number. If space is insufficient, a code symbol is used and complete heat treatment information is shown as a general note. When heat treat information is not required, other than those inherent with the material specified, a diagonal line is drawn from the lower left to the upper right-hand corner of the block.



FINISH BLOCK

The Finish block shall contain the proper finish specification for the part (preferably an NAA specification number) and any applicable item within the specification. If the space is insufficient, a code number is used and complete finish information shown as a general note. When finish information is not required, other than those inherent with the material called out, a diagonal line is drawn from the lower left to the upper right-hand corner of the block.



DATE AND SIGNATURE BLOCK

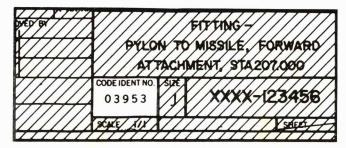
The initial (or initials) and surname, in full, of the draftsman shall be printed in the proper space. The date shall indicate the completion date of the drawing, filled in by the draftsman. The "CHK BY" line is reserved for Document Verification Group use only. The responsible engineer shall print his first intial and last name in the approval block. Supervisory or management approval of the drawing is established by approval signatures on all EO's relative to the drawing. However, supervisory approvals may be placed in the Signature block "APPROVED BY" area of the drawing as applicable.

The two spaces below the "APPROVED BY" spaces are used as follows: the top one may be used for additional administrative approvals or notes, but the bottom one must be left blank as it is reserved for customer use.

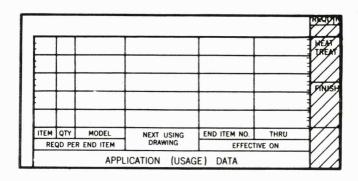

APPLICATION (USAGE) DATA BLOCK

The Application or Usage block is a supplementary block located to the left of the Title block. It contains information regarding the usage of the part, assembly, installation, etc., depicted on the drawing.

The column headings and five lines of the block are preprinted on all standard drawing vellums.



REQD PER END ITEM COLUMNS

ITEM COLUMN: The word "BASIC" or the applicable dash number shall be listed in the Item column. The parts (or items) listed are those which are delineated on the drawing and used on other drawings

QUANTITY COLUMN: The Quantity column is used to indicate the total number of parts or assemblies which are required to produce one complete end item, e.g., missile, console, etc. The number shown is the quantity of the parts which are used on the indicated next assembly, multiplied by the number of times the next assembly is used on a single end item.

When a neutral part or assembly has only one next using drawing (next assembly), the quantity shown can mean;

(1) Four parts are used on the next assembly and only one of the next assembly is required per end item.

- (2) Two parts are used on the next assembly (N/A) and two of the N/A are required per end item.
- (3) One part is used on the N/A and four of the next assembly are required per end item.

In any case, four units are required to satisfy the demands of a single end item.

Data block are used to indicate the end-item (Model) serial number and change point effectivity of the listed parts. Space is provided for listing the AF serial numbers when applicable. A single end item effectivity is shown by listing the specific end-item number followed by the word "only".

Full contract effectivity is shown by listing "1 & SUBS" in the "End Item No/Thru" columns.

Limited effectivity is shown by listing the applicable model serial number in the appropriate columns. This accomplishes the same purpose as the former "serial number coding" method, and indicates non-inter changeability of listed parts. This is also known as "firm coding".

LIST OF MATERIALS OR PARTS LIST

The list of Material (L/M) or Parts List (P/L) shall show all materials and parts which are necessary to produce the part or assembly. All parts or components which are called out as requirements on the field of the drawing shall be shown in the list of Material and, conversely, all entries in the List of Material must be called out as requirements on the field of the drawing except:

"Conventional" rivets that are called out by use of Design Standards are not to be listed in the L/M but will only be called out on the field of the drawing. The Design standard lists those rivets classed as "conventional".

Certain items classed as "burden" such as paint, putty, grease, nonelectrical wire, etc., are not listed on production drawings.

The first line of the Part Number column shall contain the drawing number.

The second and succeeding lines shall contain:

- A. The dash numbers of parts which are detailed on the drawing except -1 and -2.
- B. The part number of all parts and components used on neutral, left-hand and right-hand assemblies, tabulated assemblies, installations, etc.

When a drawing is first released or redrawn completely for re-release, parts used on an assembly will be grouped starting from the bottom, according to the following sequence:

- (1) Dash numbers of parts that are detailed on the drawing.
- (2) Parts generated at this Division under the same Model, General Order or Project number.
- (3) Parts generated at this Division under other Model, General Order or Project numbers than the basic model number of the drawing on which they are used.
- (4) Corporate or any NAA Division Standard Part number.
- (5) Military standard parts (MS, AN, etc.).
- (6) Parts governed by a military specification.
- (7) Industry standard parts (NAS, NASA, etc.).
- (8) Controlled commercial parts (SCD's).

- (9) Other NAA Division production parts.
- (10) Uncontrolled commercial parts.
- (11) Bulk items covered by military specifications.
- (12) Bulk items covered by NAA specifications.
- (13) Bulk items covered by commercial specifications.

The sequential group listing given can be divided into three main divisions. Numbers 1 thru 4 are NAA parts, numbers 5 thru 10 are classed as Outside parts, and numbers 11, 12, and 13 are considered Bulk items, i.e., items such as wire, sleeving, insulation, etc., that do not have part numbers.

The Nomenclature or Description column shall contain the noun name of all parts appearing in the List of Material, including dash-numbered details.

If a drawing is a Detail, the noun name shall be shown in the Nomenclature column adjacent to the basic part number. If the drawing falls in the category of an Assembly, Installation, Diagram, etc., then one of the above captions shall be shown on the first line of the column as applicable.

If a dash-numbered sub-assembly or an Assembly Of is listed above the first line of the column, as a component part then the noun name of the component drawing shall be shown.

If sub-assemblies are used the words SUB-ASSY shall be listed in this column.

The noun name of standard parts as they appear on the standard drawings shall be used in the L/M of the using drawings.

DATA COLUMN

Material specifications, material sizes, applicable notes and vendor information in that order and as required for each item shall be shown in the Data column. The listings are explained in the following paragraphs:

MATERIAL SPECIFICATION: The applicable government, NAA, or commercial specification for all raw stock which is used for parts that are detailed on the drawing shall be listed. In addition, the material composition, condition and type (if applicable) shall be included to fully describe the desired material.

MATERIAL SIZE: The material raw-stock size will be given for all parts which are detailed on the drawing.

<u>APPLICABLE NOTES</u>: Such notes as apply shall be placed with specific items or coded to a general note as required. The governing subject, as listed below, will determine the application of each listing.

- (1) Specification Control drawing notes.
- (2) Government furnished equipment notes.
- (3) Kit drawing notes.
- (4) Modification drawing notes.
- (5) Service notes.
- (6) Master Lines notes.
- (7) Material substitution notes.
- (8) Altered and selected part notes.

<u>VENDOR INFORMATION</u>: A manufacturer's or vendor's address is given for all commercial items. Only the company name and home office is required.

A local supplier for a company is not specified unless such a source has been indicated in the DM or SPM.

If it becomes necessary to establish sole source procurement of a commercial part, the word (ONLY) in parenthesis is inserted following the manufacturers name when it is in the general notes or in the data column of the L/M. Otherwise equivalent parts may be substituted when authorized.

If a note is required more than once, coding to a general note is usually recommended in order to avoid repetition.

LINE NUMBER COLUMN

A sequence item number, as preprinted in the Line Number Column, shall be assigned for each item listed in the List of Material or Parts List, beginning with number one (OOl) for the first item listed.

QUANTITY REQUIRED COLUMNS

The use of the "Quantity Required" columns will vary according to the type of parts or drawing.

Basic dash number variations are noted on line OOl. The quantity of "l" shall never be shown on this line, i.e., the quantity required for one part (detail, assembly, etc.) is always implied as "l", on line 001. On details, this line is reserved for indicating LH (-1) and RH (-2) parts, if the part is a "shown and "opposite" configuration. Line 001 on assemblies would similarly indicate by appropriate dash number(s) any neutral assemblies and sub-assemblies. If there are no dash number variations the QTY REQD blocks on line OOl are left blank.

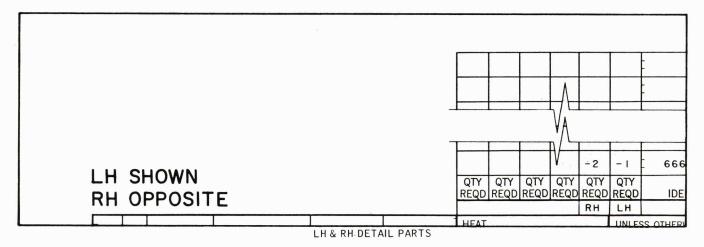
Quantities required of parts listed in a L/M start on line 002, tabulated details excepted.

On assembly drawings the quantity required of each component listed is shown in the QTY REQD column(s). This "unit quantity" notation directs the procurement and assembly of the listed definitive part numbers. regardless of the fact that the part number may define a single item, an assemblage of items, etc.

NEUTRAL DETAIL PARTS: The QTY REQD columns shall be left vacant on drawings of neutral detail parts.

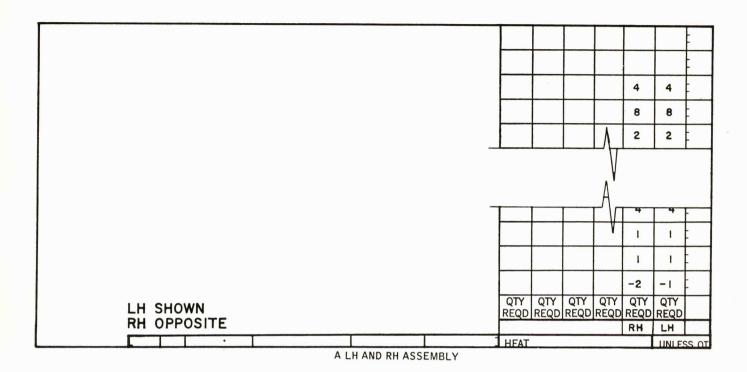

SUB-ASSEMBLIES: Groups of parts which are fastened together permanently by riveting, welding, soldering, brazing, etc., normally are drawn as an individual unit and termed an "Assembly Off" in the title, but not in the Nomenclature column.

The detailed parts of the sub-assembly are assigned dash numbers of the main assembly. The complete sub-assembly will be assigned a dash number in the same sequence as tabulated assemblies. The Nomenclature and Description column shall show the term SUB-ASSY for these assembly listing.

REVISIONS BLOCK

The Revisions Block is located in the upper right-hand corner of the drawing form. The column headings are preprinted on all standard drawing vellums. The revision block is used as a permanent record of all changes made to the drawing. Drawing revisions originate from a variety of sources and may be made for many reasons. Design changes, manufacturing and assembly difficulties, additions, deletions and changes to mating parts, and many more, may all culminate in a drawing revision. Until such time that a revision is incorporated to the print, the Engineering Order issued effecting the change will be attached to the back of the print. Under the present system, revisions are listed on a revisions record attached to the drawing.

- O Scheduling will draw the line closing out the particular lettered revision after all effectivity entries are made. Engineering will draw the close-out line when the complete revision is code 3 RECORD.
- 20NE COLUMN appears in the format for "J" size drawings only.

Cross-section conventions are used to distinguish the individual components of an assembly on the exposed surfaces of a sectional view.

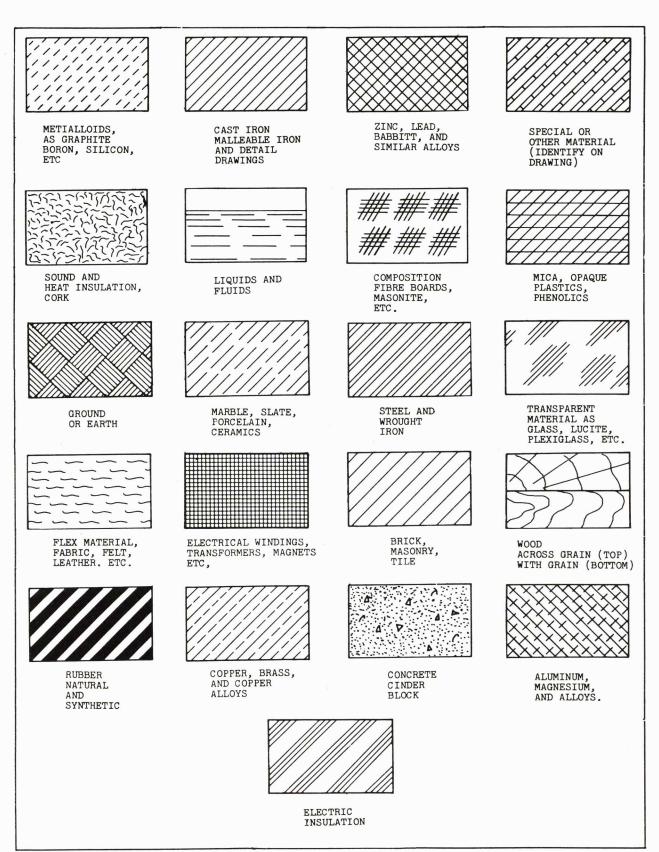
Detail drawings and all drawings showing only one material shall be sectioned as metal regardless of the material.

The simplified sectioning conventions shown are the preferred forms and should be used wherever practical.



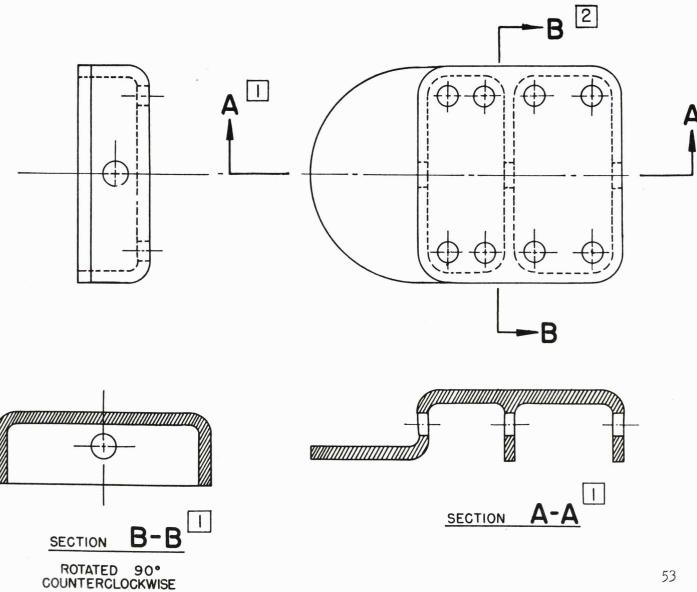

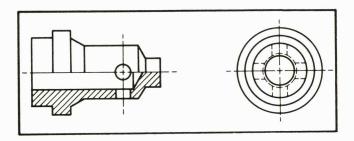


SECTIONAL VIEWS

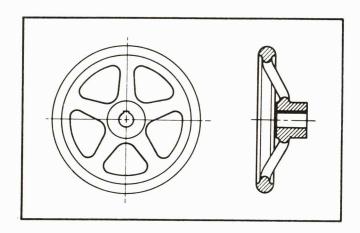
Cross-sectional views or sections are used when the inside construction of a part cannot be clearly shown by the other views. The section is taken from the part at the cutting plane. The view may be rotated when the section applies to more than one cutting plane. The note, VIEW ROTATED X° will be placed below the sectional view. Visible and invisible outlines beyond the cutting plane are not shown unless necessary for the description of the part. The zone number from which the sectional view is taken, is cross-referenced with the zone where the view is located.



A half section is a view of a symmetrical object which shows the internal and external features. This is accomplished by passing two cutting planes at right angles to each other along the center lines or symmetrical axes. Thus, one quarter of the object is considered removed and the interior exposed to view. The cutting plane indications and section titles are omitted.



When the true projection of a part may be misleading, parts such as ribs, spokes, and similar elements will be shown as if rotated into the cutting plane.

PROJECTIONS AND VIEWS

Blueprints are copies of mechanical drawings, and most mechanical drawings are orthographic projections. There are three simple views in orthographic projections: all the dimensions are shown, the proportions are true, and there is no distortion. The draftsman has "taken the object apart", showing one principle face and one or more adjoining faces.

Drawings of the adjoining faces are not connected to the principle face, but are directly above, to the left, or to the right of the principle face.

Third angle orthographic projections are the standard for engineering drawings as illustrated; however, there are six views of a third-angle projection; top, front, bottom, left side, right side, and rear. Of the six possible views, only those are used which are necessary to depict the object for purposes of manufacturing, inspection, assembly, erection, maintenance, etc.

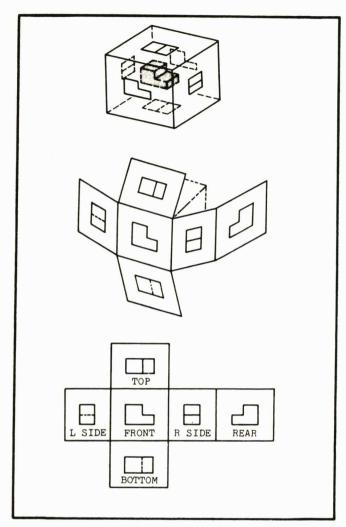

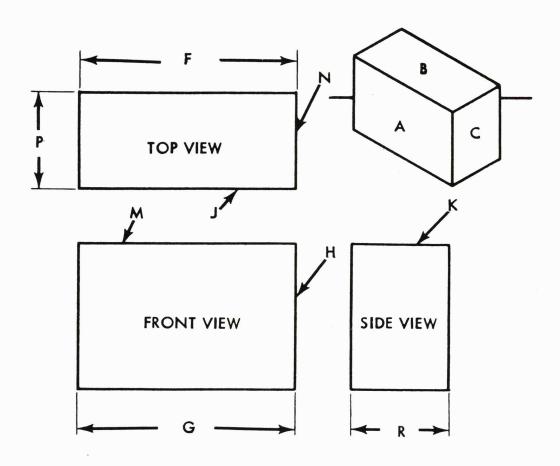
TWO-VIEW DRAWING

TWO-VIEW DRAWINGS may be arranged as any two adjacent views in the relation shown. When space is limited, it is permissible to represent symmetrical objects by half-views. The half-views may extend slightly beyond the center line of symmetry and terminate with a break line. If the adjacent view is an exterior view, the near half of the symmetrical view shall be drawn.

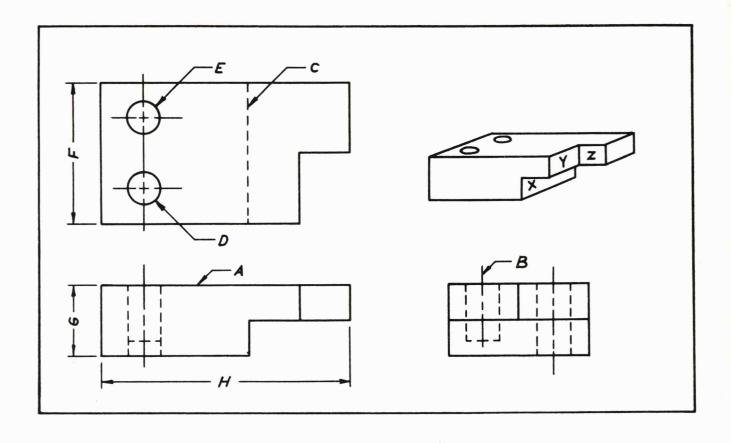

DETAIL DRAWING

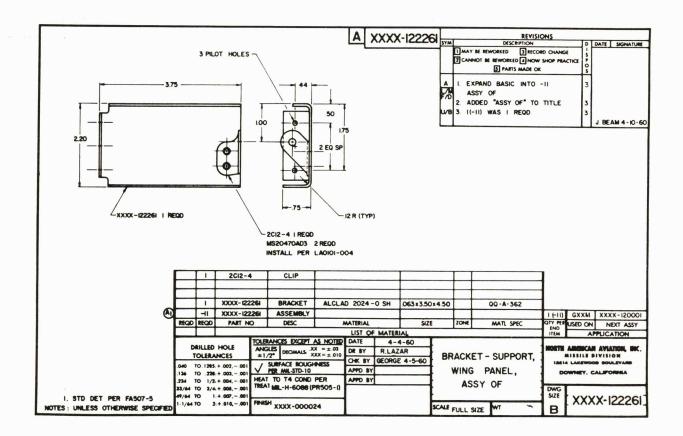
A detail drawing represents a single part and shall specify all the dimensions, material, and information required for its manufacture, either directly on the drawing or by reference. Assembly information is not shown on a detail print, since these prints are not used in an assembly department. One to seven different views of the part may be used on the print, depending how simple or complex the part may be.



ASSEMBLY DRAWING

An assembly drawing is a drawing showing two or more parts put together to form an assembly. It shows the true relationship of the detail parts to one another. It shows as many views as are necessary to build the assembly and usually has a number of sectional and detail views to clarify portions of the drawing. It calls out such parts as nuts, bolts, screws, rivets, etc., that are used to hold the assembly together. Dash

numbering of the details of an assembly is sometimes used to save drafting time and the expense of making seprate drawings for every part;
however, they shall not be called out on any other drawing. Sub-assemblies
are also called out by dash numbers on an assembly print when other
parts are shown on the print.



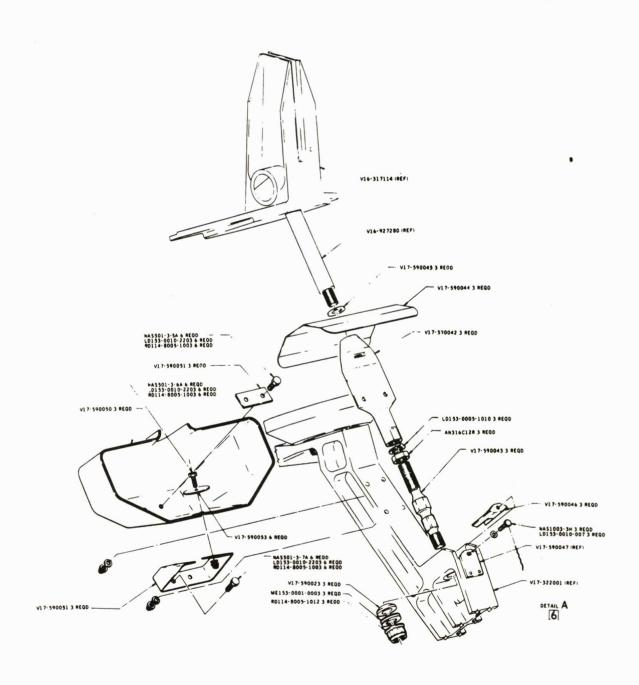
INSTALLATION DRAWING

The term Installation, as used in the section, refers only to the positioning and attachment of completed units into major assemblies or end items. It is not intended to mean launching sites or other facilities, commonly referred to as installations. An installation print provides all of the information necessary to locate parts and assemblies in their final position in the missile. All of the attaching bolts, nuts, screws, etc., necessary for attaching the various parts together are

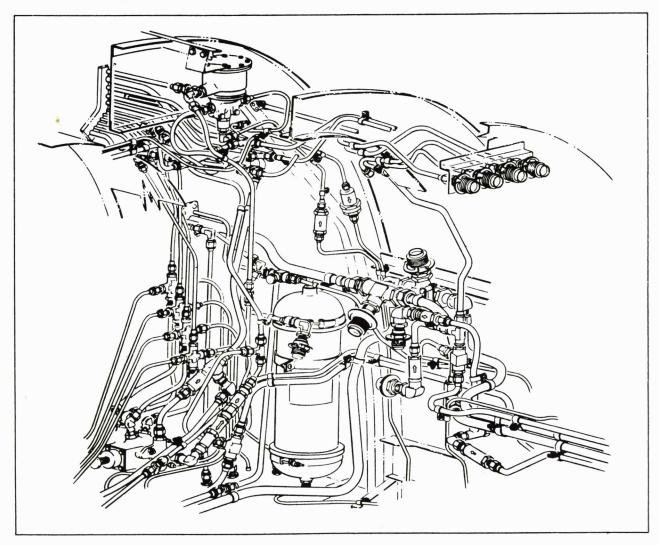

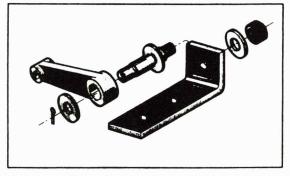


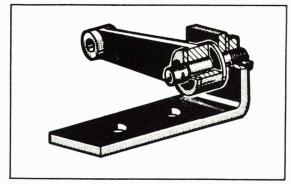
PERSPECTIVE DRAWING

Perspective drawings are sometimes used in conjunction with orthographic projections. They are usually limited to large assemblies, installations, and castings, to help the mechanic to visualize the finished part.

Generally, parts will be called out, but locating dimensions will not be shown.

LEFT HAND, RIGHT HAND, AND NEUTRAL PART DESIGNATIONS

For two parts to be considered left and right hand they must be symmetrically opposite, i.e., mirror images of each other. The left-hand part always is pictured on a drawing and the right-hand part is indicated as being opposite.

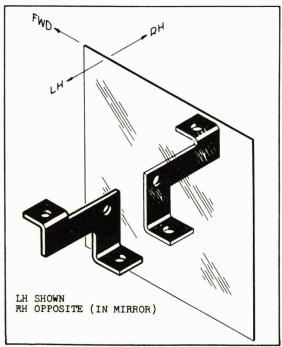
The designations "LH" and "RH" are used for all symmetrically opposite parts even though they are not truly on the left and right sides of the end item. For example, an "upper" part may have a symmetrically opposite "lower" part; for convenience, the "upper" part is termed "LH" and the "lower" part is termed "RH".

A neutral part is one which has no symmetrically opposite counterpart, or which is symmetrical within itself.

Deviations from this procedure will be plainly noted on the drawing.

When the direction in which the view is taken is not obvious from the picture, it will be designated as: View Looking Forward, or View

Looking Aft.

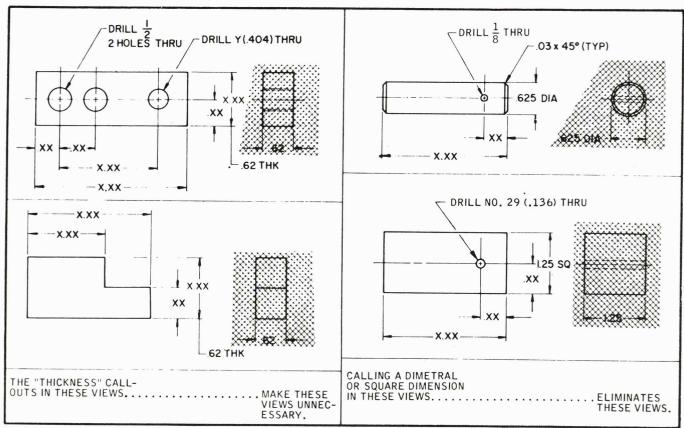


LH AND RH PARTS ARE MIRROR IMAGES (SYMMETRICALLY OPPOSITE) OF EACH OTHER

SINGLE VIEWS

Simple one-view drawings may be made when such features as thickness, shape (DIA, SQ, HEX, etc.), or holes (THRU) may be indicated by notes.

Even complex parts may be drawn in one view without sacrificing clarity.



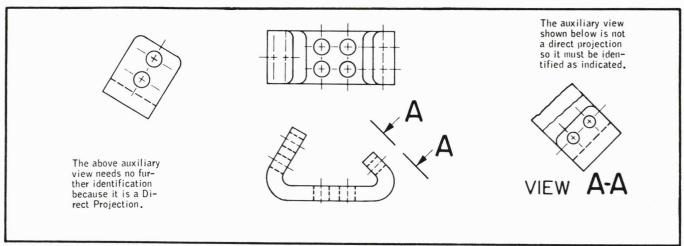
TYPICAL ONE-VIEW PRESENTATION

AUXILIARY VIEWS

Auxiliary views are are used for objects having inclined faces or other features which are not parallel to any of the three principal planes of projection, in order to show the true shape of such features. In many cases, partial auxiliary views which show only the pertinent features may be employed to illustrate features not clearly shown by the principal views. The auxiliary views shall be arranged as though the auxiliary plane were revolved into the plane of the paper, by consid-

ering it hinged to the plane to which it is perpendicular.

When an auxiliary view is a direct projection from another face or feature, it does not require the use of viewing plane location indicators and labels. However, if the auxiliary view is not projected in the manner described above, viewing plane indicators shall be utilized and the view labeled.



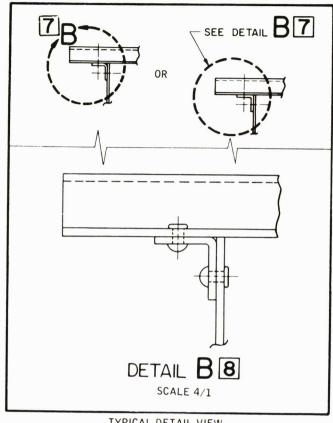
TYPICAL AUXILIARY VIEWS

DETAIL VIEWS

Detail views are used when it is desirable to show enlarged views of parts for dimensioning purposes or clarity.

Detail indicator lines are preferably circular. However, they may be any reasonable shape to surround a desired area, such as elliptical, square (with rounded corners), etc. Because a detail is not a true projection, it shall always be given an identifying letter even if only one is shown on a drawing. If the scale of the view varies from the main scale of the drawing, it will be noted. The zone number from which the detail view is taken, is cross-referenced with the zone number where the view is located. The part to be detailed is circled except for a small gap that shows the detail letter designation.

Next to the detail letter, the referenced zone number is shown.

GENERAL AND LOCAL NOTES

GENERAL NOTES: General notes refer to the part as a whole. Notes which affect a large majority of the part should be included in the general notes.

General notes are usually located along the lower border of the drawing and to the left of the Application (Usage) Data block. The notes will be preceded by the statement:

NOTES: UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED

The above wording eliminates the necessity of using the word ALL with any notes listed above it, e.g., a bend radius or a roughness listed

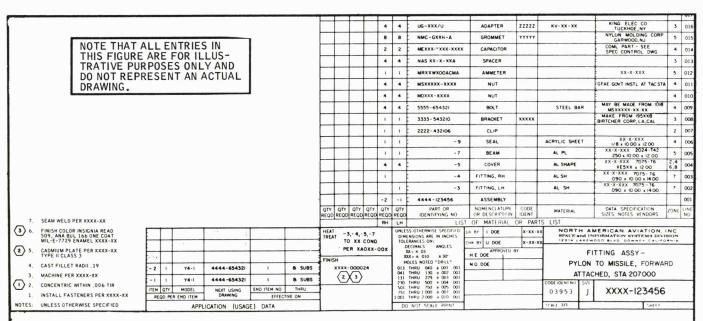
in the General Notes applies to all unless shown otherwise in a specific place on the drawing.

General notes should be employed whenever it is necessary to specify information such as:

- (1) Installation instructions such as process and fabrication specifications.
- (2) Tolerancing notes such as those for concentricity or normality. These notes are coded to the applicable dimensions or areas on the Field of the Drawing.
- (3) Machining, inspection, or fabricating instructions or notes.
- (4) Surface roughness designation.
- (5) Bend, fillet or corner radii which may apply to numerous places on the drawing.
- (6) Casting and forging notes.
- (7) Any pertinent information regarding the item depicted on the drawing such as test requirements, serviceability, etc.
- (8) Coded notes when space is inadequate in the areas provided in the L/M, U/B, T/B or drawing field, e.g., if there is insufficient room in the Data column for listing of a manufacturer's name and address for a commercial part, this note may be coded to the applicable item(s) in that column. Similarly if the callout of numerous zones, overcrowds the Zone column, they may be coded to a general note.

When a general note is no longer needed, it should be removed from the drawing. An entry is then made in the Revision block indicating the removal of the note. Note and code numbers, removed in this manner, may be reused for a new note either at the time of removal or at a subsequent date.



In the above examples of general notes:

Notes 1, 3 and 4 are applicable to the Field of the Drawing or the drawing as a whole.

Note 2: Is a machining note and is coded to specific dimensions on the part.

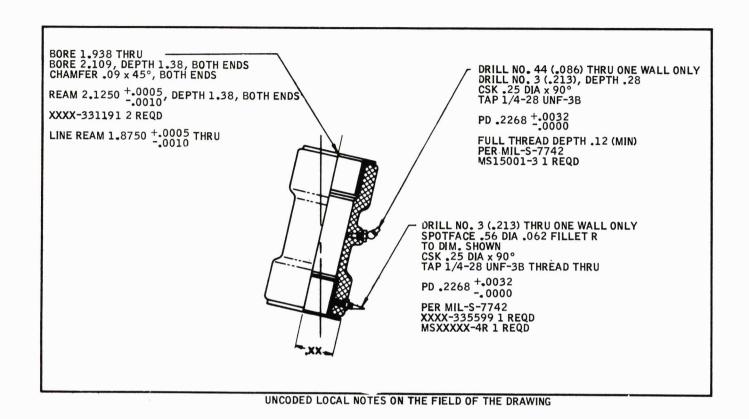
Notes 5 and 6: These finish notes were too large to be placed in the finish block; therefore, they were placed in the general notes and coded to the finish block. If such notes apply to specific areas only, they would be coded to the Field of the Drawing or the data column as required

Note that coding numbers run consecutively but are independent of the general note numbers.

FORMAT AND TYPICAL EXAMPLES OF GENERAL NOTES

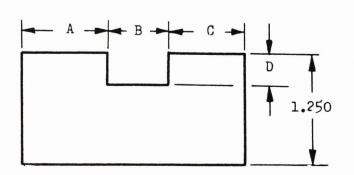
UNCODED LOCAL NOTES: Local notes are callouts which appear on the face of the drawing. They apply to specific operations or instructions. They are placed adjacent to the point which such operations are to be performed.

The callout leader line shall be taken from one end or the other of the top line to the part to which the note applies. If a note refers to more than one place, arrows shall indicate each one unless the application is clear without extra arrows. A repeated callout, however, is always given as a reference (REF).



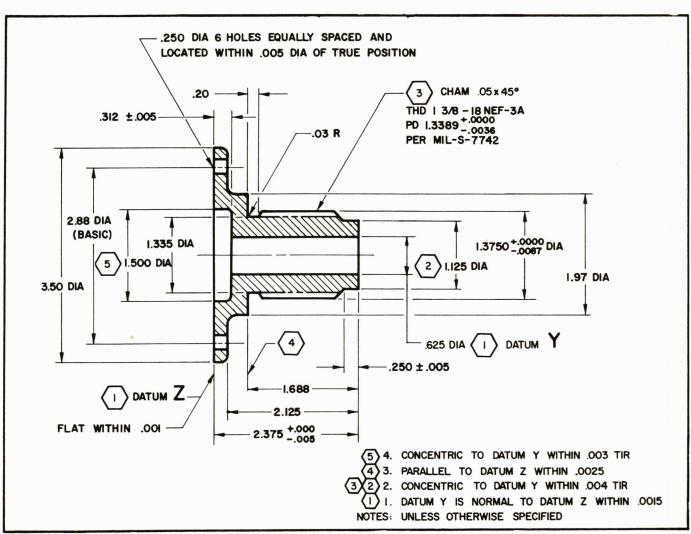
To identify different parts on a tabulated drawing:

Tabulated drawings usually show a number of parts basically the same except for size on one drawing and usually from one view. If two or more dimensions differ at the same point, a letter (A, B, C, etc.) will be substituted and the dimensions will be shown in the tabulation block.

CODED LOCAL NOTES: When required, local notes may be coded to applicable general notes. A common application is with tolerancing features.



CODED LOCAL AND GENERAL NOTES

RIVET CODING AND CALLOUT

The rivet code symbol is based on a cross (+). Rivet type, size, installation requirements, and direction of the manufactured head are indicated by letter-numeral coding placed in quadrants formed by the cross. The cross may be located at the center of a rivet or off to one side with an arrow pointing to the center of the rivet.

The quadrants are identified as

The rivet coding applicable to each of the quadrants is defined as follows:

RIVET TYPE: is indicated by two basic code letters placed in the NW quadrant, for example:

RIVET DIAMETER: is indicated by a number placed in the NE quadrant. This number equals the number of 32nds of an inch in the rivet diameter. The direction of the manufactured head is also indicated by either the placement of, or omission of, the letter "F" in the NE quadrant. The letter "F" placement indicates the manufactured head is on the far side. For example:

CY 6F = MS20426DD6 countersunk head, aluminum alloy 2024-T31 rivet, 3/16 (6/32) inch diameter, manufactured head on far side. CY 6 = The same MS20426DD6 rivet but with the manufactured head on near side.

RIVET LENGTH OR GRIP: is indicated by a number placed in the SE quadrant. This number is the dash number portion of the rivet standard part number which signifies either the rivet length or grip.

For example:

RL 6 = NAS1398D - Pull type, locked spindle, blind rivet

2017 aluminum alloy, 3/16 inch diameter, 3/8 inch

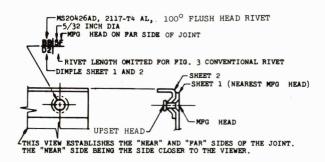

FLUSH RIVETING OPERATIONS: are indicated by a letter-number code placed in the SW quadrant.

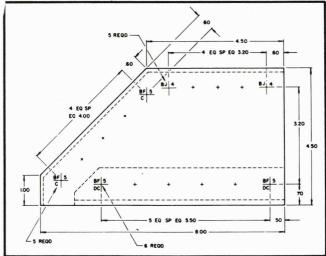

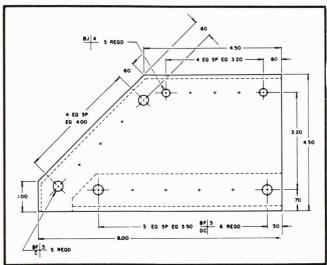
RIVET CODING AND CALLOUT

In applications where space permits, the code symbol shall be shown at the location of the rivet. For clearly defined rivet groups (3 rivets or more) only the end rivets need be coded. For mixed groups, each change in rivet size or type must be clearly defined either by showing a code at each rivet location or a code at the end of each rivet group.



PREFERRED METHOD OF RIVET CODING

In applications where space is limited, the code symbol should be shown off to the side (preferably not on the view) and the location of the rivet indicated by an arrow. The arrow should point to the first rivet on the left side of the group. Each change in rivet size or type must be clearly indicated. Show the end rivets of each group as circles equal to twice the shank diameter drawn to scale.



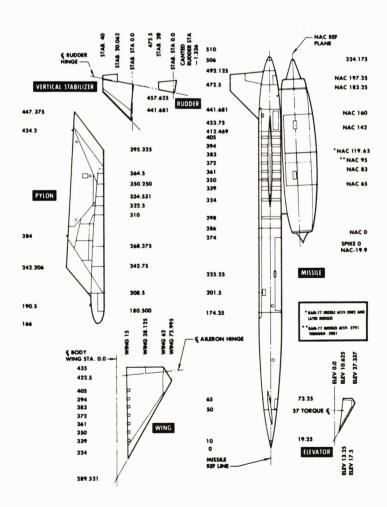
LIMITED SPACE METHOD OF RIVET CODING

STATIONING

Station 0 on the fuselage is usually the nose of the Missile and all frames, bulkheads, etc., which are located in the fuselage are located on a station point. The station will be the number of inches aft of Station 0. For instance, if a frame is to be located on Station 27.500, it will be exactly $27\frac{1}{2}$ inches back from Station 0.

Station 0 on the wings is usually located at the root section of the wing and goes outboard.

Flap and Aileron station points usually start (Station 0) at a point near the inboard edge of the assembly.



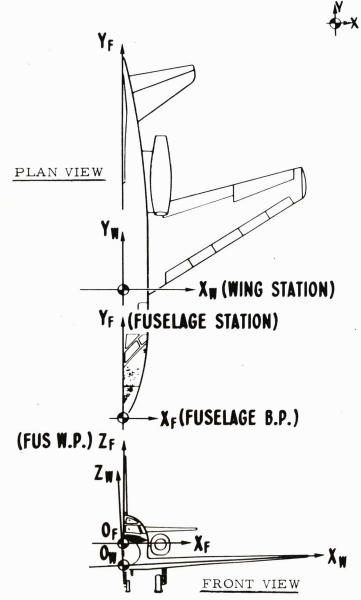
CARTESIAN COORDINATES

A system of dimensioning known as "Cartesian Coordinates" is used on some N.A.A. drawings. The dimensions are identified by the "X", "Y", and " Z^n coordinates.

It should be remembered that these coordinates indicate a direction rather than a station, buttock line, water line, percent plane, etc.

The sketch on the following page illustrates in detail this method of airframe dimensioning.

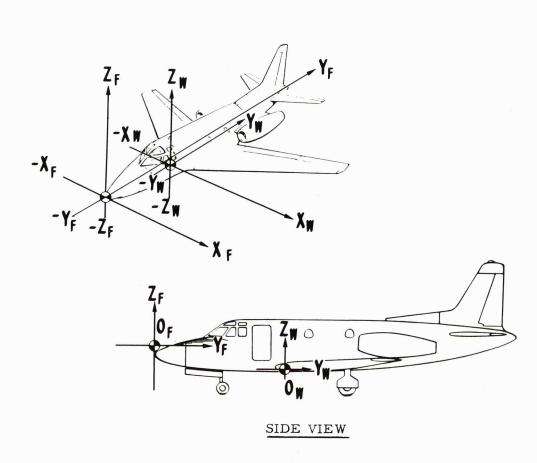

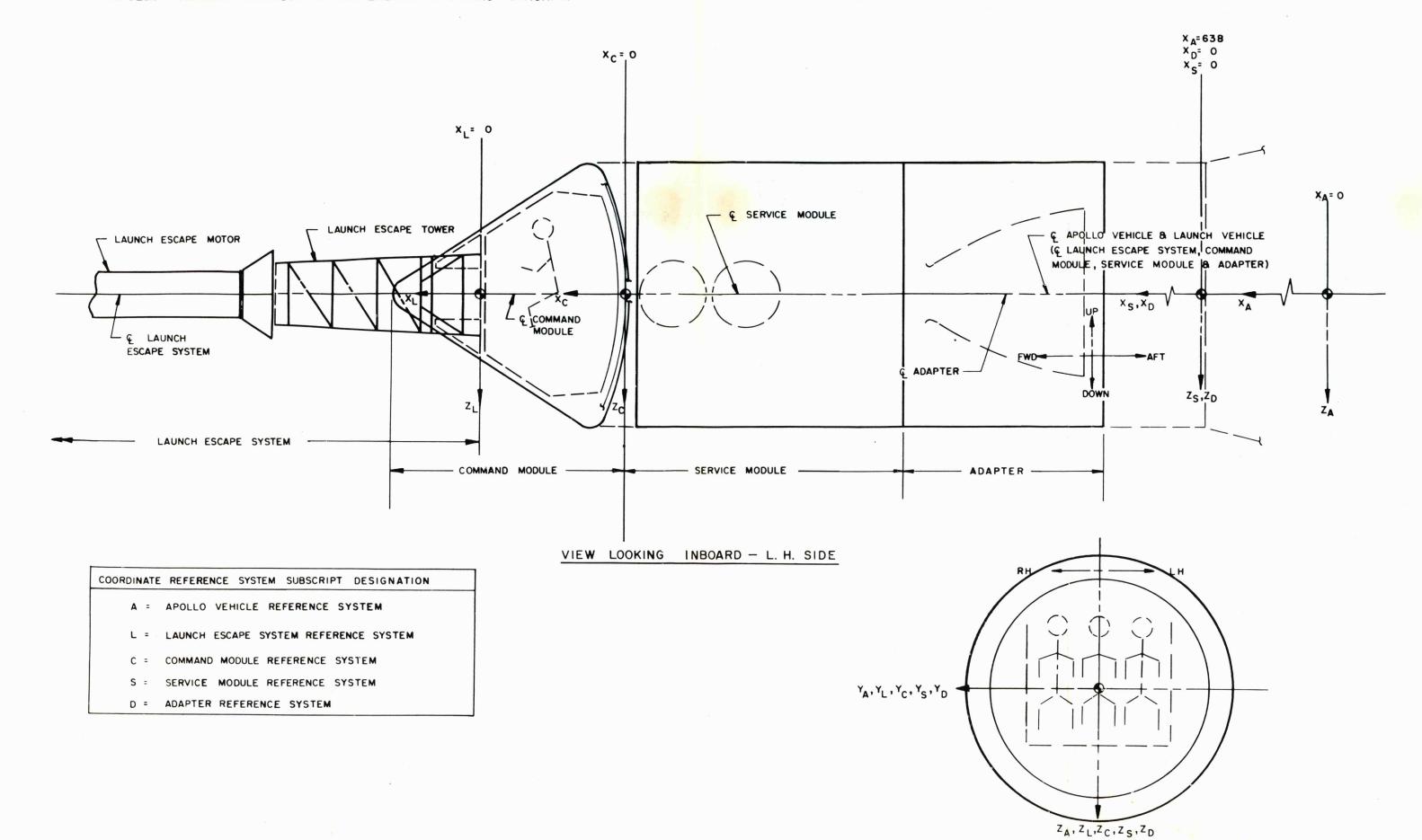


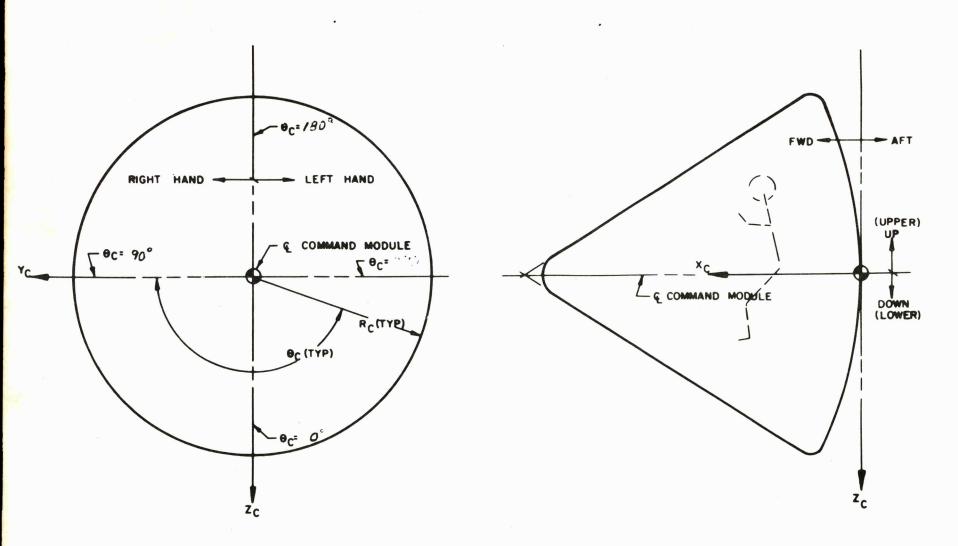

BUTTOCK AND WATER PLANES

Buttock planes lie in the vertical position and are used to measure horizontal distances to the left and right of the fuselage centerline.

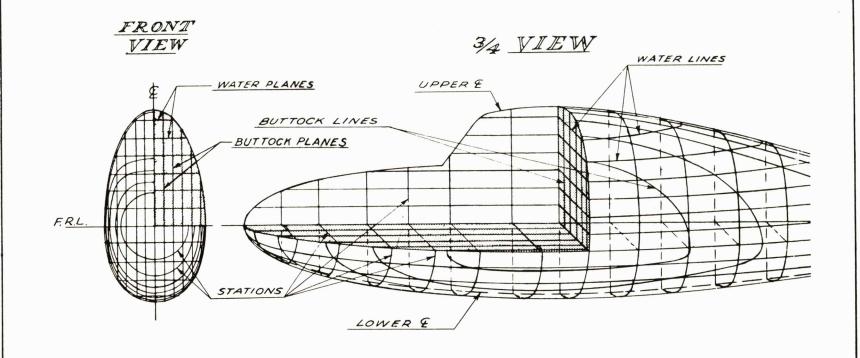
Water planes are horizontal in position and are used to measure distances above and below the "Fuselage Reference Line". A water plane below the FRL is called a minus WP (-WP).

Fuselage Station Lines measure distances aft of a forward reference point.

Any station forward of Fuselage Station O is called a minus station.

The sketch on the following page illustrates in detail this method of airframe dimensioning.

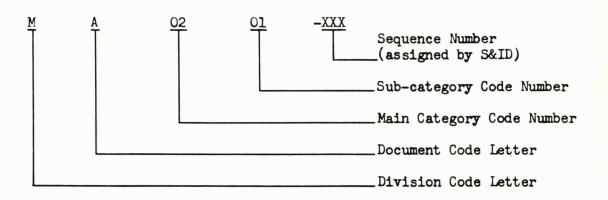

The above document identity letters have the prefix "M" which identifies the document as a Space and Information Systems Division document.

MA - Process Specifications

Process Specifications are written primarily to establish engineering requirements, supplemental to drawings. They establish methods and procedures that are essential to the fabrication, installation, or testing of a specific part or assembly. They present engineering requirements and are not used as design criteria.

MB - Material Specifications

Material Specifications are the formulated, definite, and complete requirements for basic raw materials, semifabricated materials, and semifinished materials.

MC - Procurement Specifications

Procurement Specifications are used to present clear and accurate descriptions of the technical requirements for purchased products (parts or assemblies intended as components of equipment), equipment (complete units or systems), and technical services. They shall include the requirements for acceptance and qualification testing in order to verify that such requirements have been met. They shall also include the necessary requirements for packing, packaging, preserving, marking, or other essential characteristics.

MD - Standard Parts Drawing

Standard Parts Drawings shall be used only for parts completely designed by the initiator of the standard or for vendor parts being altered by NAA. The drawing must show complete information for the manufacture of the NAA designed part or for alteration of the vendor part.

ME - Control Documents (Specification Control Drawings)

A Control Document is used to establish control over design and performance requirements of procurable items (commercial or vendor designed and manufactured for purposes of acceptance and reprocurement. This document may be self-sufficient, or when the item to be procured is a development item, a Procurement Specification defining the design and performance requirements and related acceptance and qualification tests, as well as preparation for delivery requirements, is prepared and referenced in the ME document.

MJ - Contract Specifications (Model Specifications)

A Contract Specification is a contractual document which presents a clear and accurate physical description and the functional requirements of an end item, designated by a model number. Additionally, Contract Specifications define the intent (scope of work) of the contracted effort and provide the basis for determining whether proposed changes to the scope of work are beyond the initial agreement.

MH - Interface Control Documents

An Interface Control Document shows the design agreement between S&ID and contractor(s), by means of a formal document.

MK - Packaging Engineering Drawings

Packaging Engineering Drawings are used to present technical requirements and instructions for protection and shipment of manufactured items.

MM - MRO Standards

Maintenance, Repair, and Operating (MRO) Supply Standards will cover items of equipment, machinery, structures or consumable materials, used on a recurring basis, for plant outfitting, maintaining, or operating purposes; and items used in processing or fabricating the end item when such processing or fabricating items are not specified or controlled by engineering MRO Standards do not include any items which become a permanent part of the end item.

MP - Design Standards (Practices)

Design Standards (Practices) are used for establishing basic engineering criteria and terminology. Commonly used design practices, such as rivet code and callout information, Weld Symbols, fabrication details, etc., are typical of this application.

MQ - Quality Control Specifications

Quality Control Specifications will establish detailed quality control requirements, methods, and standards. They will be written to specify quality requirements or quality information supplemental to Engineering requirements and will be issued only if it is not feasible to establish quality requirements in other media, such as Engineering specifications, purchase order codes, or divisional procedures.

MS - Standard Shapes Drawings

A Standard Shapes Drawing describes the cross-sectional parameters of a common design shape without regard to length. By noting the standard shape number and length on the engineering drawing, a configuration may be defined in detail without preparation of a separate detailed drawing.

V. PROCESS SPECIFICATIONS

Definitions

General Process Specifications are divided into two types: MAO1 specifications for general use and MAO6 specifications that provide a general process for a program (Apollo, Saturn S-II, etc.). These specifications provide engineering and quality requirements applicable to the process, as well as manufacturing methods essential to the fabrication of a part.

Specific Process Specifications (MAO2, MAO3, MAO4) provide requirements relative to installation, assembly, calibration, etc., of specific parts and assemblies identified by part or assembly numbers.

Records and Forms Specifications (MAO5) provide indices of all S&ID released process specifications, both active and inactive.

Mandatory Corporate Specification - A specification identified by the letter "G" in place of the division identity letter and established by Corporate Engineering Standards as mandatory for all divisions.

Permissive Corporate Specification - A specification identified by a division identity letter and established as a corporate document at the request of two or more divisions.

VI. MATERIAL SPECIFICATIONS

Types of Material Specifications

There are two types of Material Specifications, both of which are applicable to manufacturing functions and are of primary concern to production engineering departments:

- A. <u>Productive Material Specifications (MBO1)</u> govern raw materials from which finished parts are manufactured or which become a part of a deliverable item.
- B. Processing Material Specifications (MBO2) govern processing materials which do not become a part of a contract end item, but are required for use during fabrication of the item and are called out for use in conjunction with process specifications.

Numbering Systems

The numbering system for Material Specifications is the same as for Process Specifications, except the letter "B" is used to identify the Material Specification document. This numbering system shall be used on all new material specifications and existing material specifications as they are revised and reissued.

Material Specifications released at the Tulsa facility are identified by use of number "8" as the first digit of the dash number, e.g., -8101, -8102, etc.

<u>DRAWING REQUIREMENTS MANUAL</u>: Prepared by the procedures group of the Engineering department, and used as a guide by the engineer to insure standardization of drafting practices.

The DRM is essentially a source of design information but may be used by the shop departments for reference purposes.

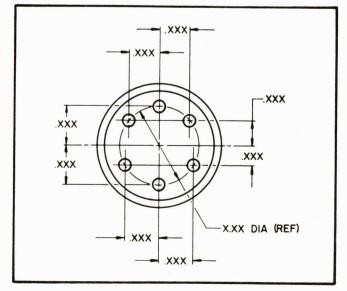

DIMENSIONING

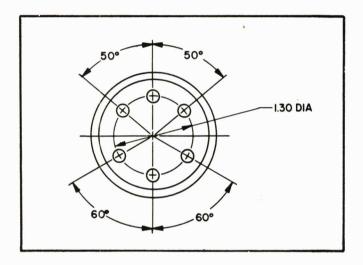
Dimensions are indicated by the use of lines, symbols, numbers and notes on drawings to define geometrical characteristics such as size, form, and location. Each line surface or point shall be located by one, and only one, set of dimensions which will not be duplicated in other views except as reference dimensions.

Size, form, and location are specified by means of two fundamental dimension systems, rectangular (or offset, or coordinate) and angular dimensioning. Both systems may be used on the same drawing, but any given surface or point must be located by only one system.

Rectangular dimensioning is the preferred method of indicating distances, locations, and size by means of linear dimensions measured parallel to reference lines or planes which are perpendicular to each other.

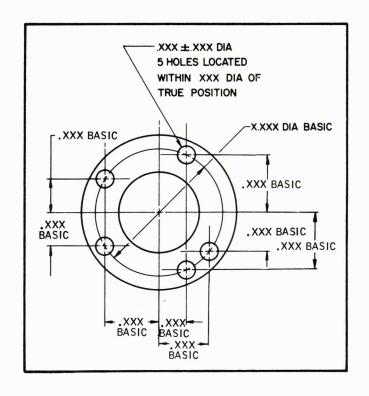


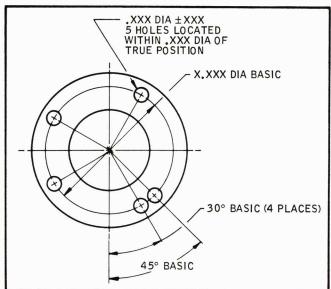
Angular dimensioning is the method of indicating the position of a point, line, or surface by means of linear dimension and angle, other than 90 degree angle implied by the horizontal and vertical center lines. The angular method is useful for specifying the location of several holes on a common arc where greater than nominal decimal tolerances (per drawing Title block, or other) can be permitted, and for the indication of simple bend angles on sheet metal parts.



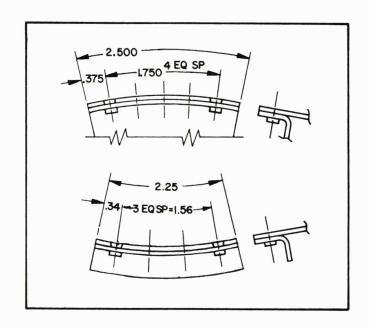
True-position dimensioning is the method of indicating distances, locations, spaces, and positions of points first in their basic or true position, then by specifying in note form the permissible variation or tolerance from this true position.

This method allows maximum manufacturing tolerances, but eliminates accumulation of tolerances since the hole-to-hole relationships are controlled by variation from true position. It is adapted particularly to many repeated patterns, such as holes, slots, bosses, tabs, etc., but is not confined to repeated patterns.





Curved Surfaces: In dimensioning the spacing of holes and other features of curved surfaces or contours, care should be taken to indicate clearly the surfaces on which the dimensioned points are to be measured, and whether the dimensions are rectangular, chordal or circumferential. Circular or cylindrical parts, in general, are dimensioned from or about center line.



Dimension lines are used to show the extent of lengths, widths, thicknesses, etc., to which the dimensions apply. Suitable spacing is about 1/2 inch between a dimension line and the outline of the part, and about 3/8 inch between parallel dimension lines.

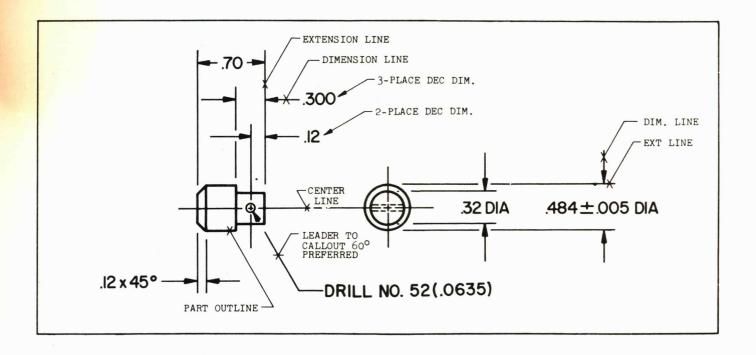
Extension lines are used to denote locations, such as points or surfaces, between which the dimension applies. They are drawn perpendicular to dimension lines and generally start about 1/16 inch from the outline of the part and extend to about 1/8 inch beyond the outermost dimension line.

Center lines are used to indicate points and axes of symmetry. They
may be extended to show relationships of symmetrical features and also
to serve as extension lines for deminsional purposes. A center line
never shall be used as a dimension line.

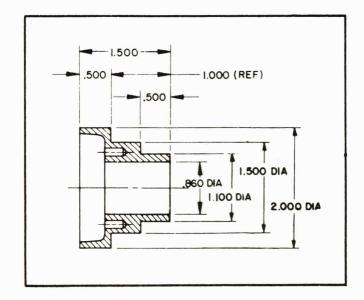
Two center lines shall be drawn at right angles to each other in views showing a circular contour, and the short dashes should intersect at the center of circles or circular features.

Dimensions are always shown in inches unless otherwise noted. All dimensions are intended to be read from one direction.

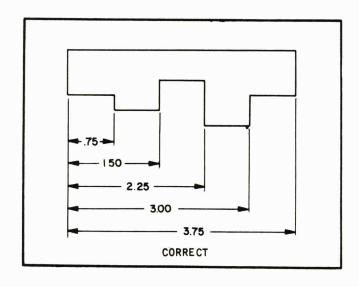
When reading a blueprint, use the dimensions shown, do not scale the drawing.

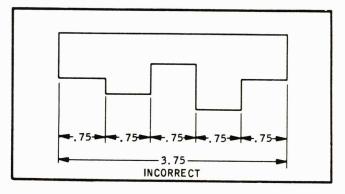


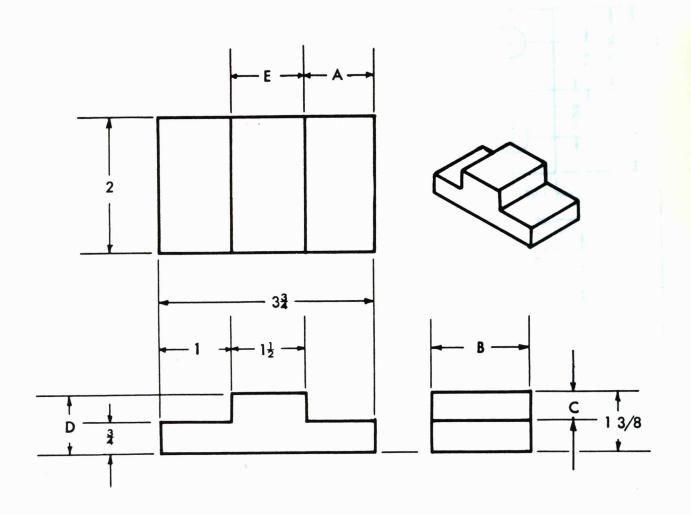
Preferable, dimensions shall be taken from visible outlines rather than from hidden lines. Dimensions shall be placed between extension lines wherever practical.



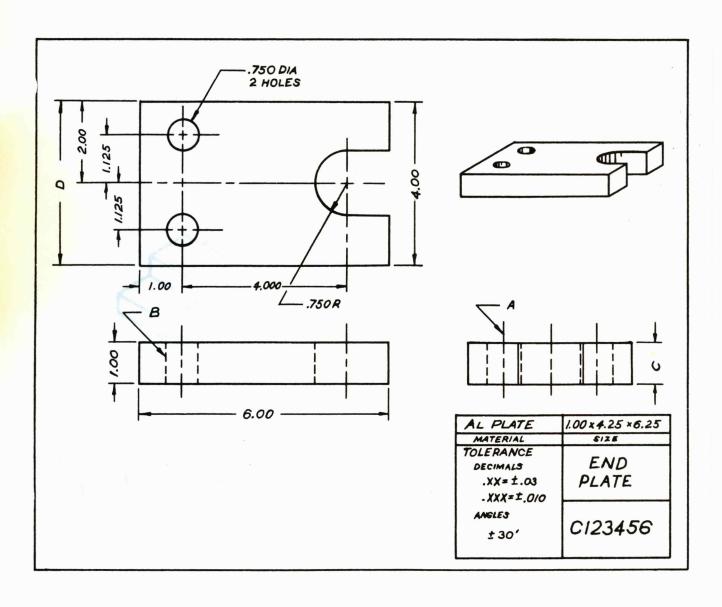
Base Line Dimensioning: Accumulation of tolerances may be avoided by using base line dimensioning, but in no case should non-critical surfaces or hole positions be held to closer tolerances than necessary in order to apply base line dimensioning on the drawing. Base line dimensioning implies that features (points, holes, edges, cutouts, etc.) are located relative to a pair of common base lines which are normally perpendicular to each other.



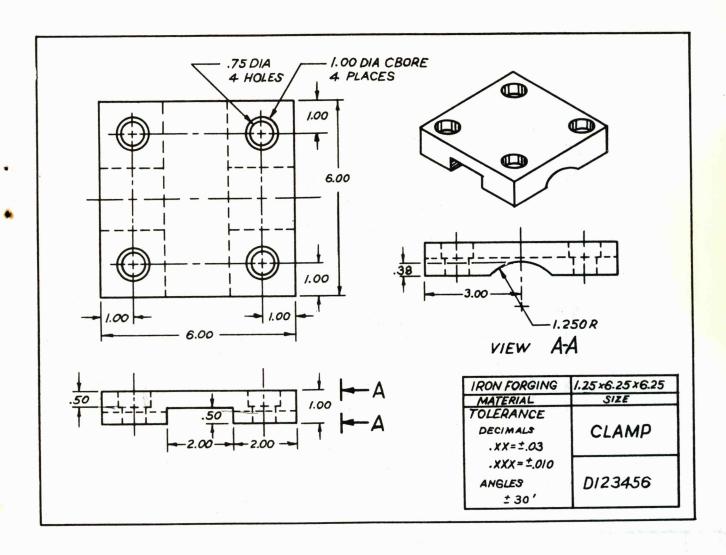

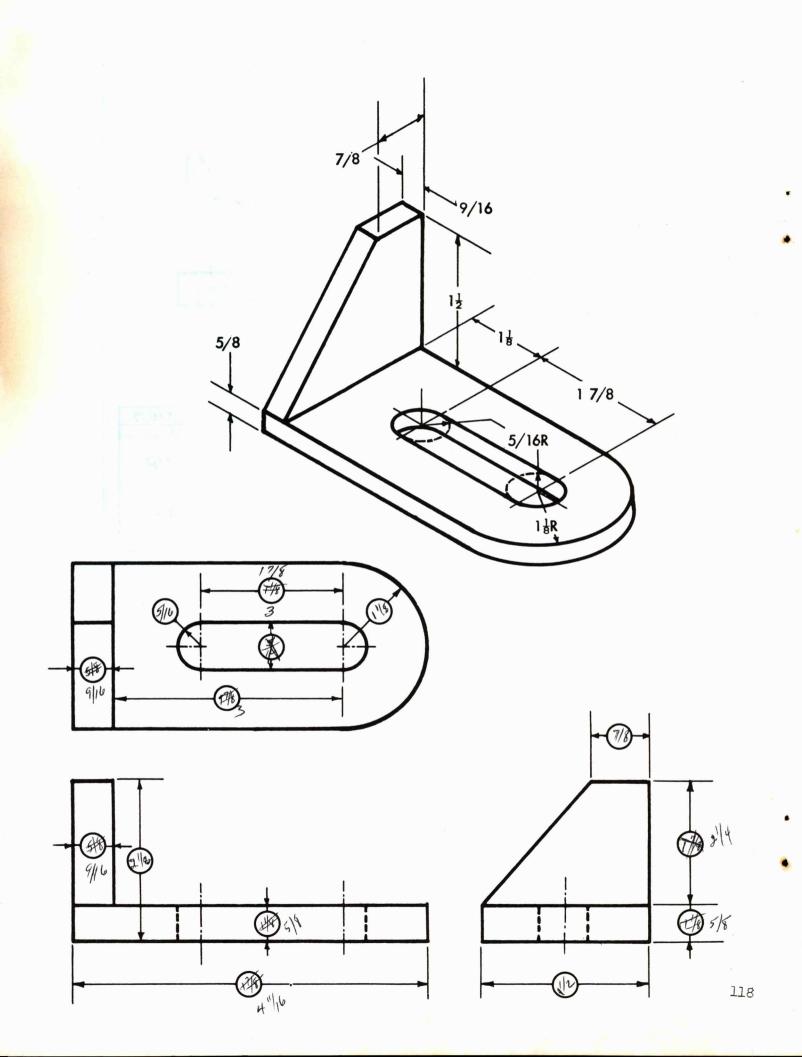

DRAWING CHANGE

CHANGE AUTHORIZATION: Changes originate from either an outstanding Engineering Order, a properly approved Request for Drawing Change (RDC) which may be reflected by the issuance of an EO or incorporated into the drawing direct at the time of drawing revision. An RDC will be initiated for an improved design that is sanctioned by a group leader.

An Engineering Order (EO) is the means by which engineering releases drawings, process specifications, etc. It may also be used to obsolete parts, stop work, authorize rework, incorporate a change or to make a new part.

A Request for Drawing Change (RDC) is the means whereby a proposed change or sketch of a change may be submitted to the engineering group for approval and then incorporation into the drawing.

ENGINEERING ORDER (EO)

The purpose of Engineering Orders is to release requirements and to distribute drawings. They release process specifications and engineering information. EO's also provide a fast means of making and authorizing minor changes to a drawing that has been previously released.

Changes which affect more than one drawing, up to a maximum of 8 drawings, may be released on a single EO if the changes are related to the same design revision or if an identical change is being made to more than one drawing.

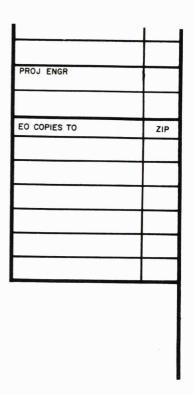
A copy of a Change-type EO will be attached to all prints of the affected drawing except Part By Number release. This type of EO is known as an "Outstanding Change" to the drawing number it is written against, and not superseded or cancelled, must eventually be incorporated into the drawing. The superseded EO is not an outstanding EO; but remains attached until the superseding EO is incorporated. "Outstanding Change" EO's are EO's which indicate that the drawing is to be changed.

On single sheet drawings, all outstanding EO's shall be incorporated when a maximum of ten EO's is reached. On multisheet drawings, all outstanding EO's shall be incorporated when one of the following conditions exist:

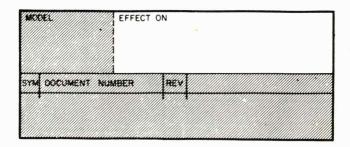
- (1) Ten EO's against the first sheet.
- (2) Five EO's against any subsequent sheet.
- (3) A total of twenty EO's against all sheets.

EO FORM SPACES

COPIES TO: The columns headed "COPIES TO" shall be used to distribute copies of the EO to others not normally named on the regular EO distribution list. The zip column shall include the mailing code number. These spaces are also used by the Release Group to route copies to major sub-contractors and other facilities.



EFFECT ON: The "EFFECT - ON" block is provided primarily to indicate the appropriate "CHANGE POINTS", or the production point on which changes or new drawings become effective. It is also used to indicate the production point at which Stop Orders become effective.



PARTS MADE: The PARTS MADE block will be filled in on Change-type EO's by placing an (X) or a symbol in the applicable square to indicate the desired position of parts already completed to the currently released drawings. Unless otherwise noted, the choice of a disposition shall be based on the assumption that all of the total quantity of required parts have already been completed.

MAY BE REWORKED will be indicated when Engineering approves the use of parts or assemblies reworked as shown. This disposition will also be indicated when the nature of the change is such that it is impossible to rework the parts to be exact to the configuration shown, but by means of special instructions (shown on the EO, or on a separate EO, or on a Rework Drawing) the parts may be made usable. This disposition gives Manufacturing Scheduling the option to scrap existing parts and make new parts in lieu of accomplishing the rework.

OK TO USE will be indicated when all parts made to the currently effective design configuration can be used.

NOTED will be indicated when the disposition requires an explanation in the body of the Engineering Order.

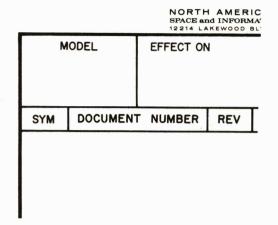
EO BY: The "EO BY" block provides space for the EO writer's name, phone extension, and group. The date on which the EO is written shall be included in the space.

<u>SUPV.</u>: The "SUPV." block provides space for signature by supervision of the person writing the EO as well as the signatures of the supervision of the Engineering Group responsible for the affected drawing.

CHECKED BY: The "CHECKED BY" block provides space for the signature of the checker in Document Verification responsible for EO clarification. The date will be entered upon completion of the checking function.

STRESS: "STRESS" check and signature by the Structures
Group prior to release may be required at the discretion
of the Group or by the Project Engineer by encircling the
word "Stress."

MODEL BLOCK: On Change EO's (including Stop Orders, Part-By-Number, Information, etc.), only those models affected by the change or those models for which the change is being released shall be listed in the Model block; the work "ONLY" shall be used in these cases to indicate (1) that there are other models and (2) that the other models are unaffected.

REFERENCED EO: The "REFERENCED EO" block is provided for listing the serial numbers of other EO's which are related. Coordinated EO numbers are listed in the body of the EO directly above this block.

TYPE: Code & Subject space shall indicate the kind of action which the EO is designed to accomplish. When two or more types of EO's are combined, the clock shall contain each type. A "STOP ORDER" and a "STOP ORDER RELEASE" are the only types that may carry the word "STOP."

SYMBOL, DOCUMENT NUMBER AND REVISION LETTER COLUMNS: When releasing drawings or other documents, or ordering parts, the numbers shall be listed in either numerical or parts-list order directly under "DOC-UMENT NUMBER". When drawings or other documents are being released, the number shall be prefixed by the symbol Ø, entered in the "Symbol" column. The symbol indicates the prints will be made and distributed.

When new drawings are being released, the word "NEW" shall be shown under the "Revision column" heading. When a drawing is being initially released under a letter change, the words "INITIAL RELEASE" shall be shown parenthetically adjacent to the drawing number.

When changed drawings are being released, the last change letter shall be shown under the "Revision column".

"Number Required" and "Next Using Drawing" columns are used only when ordering parts by Part Number-type or EO Drawing type EO's. The "Number Required" shall be used to indicate the quantity to be ordered. When a supersedure EO is written, the Reason & Remarks space shall repeat the original reason for the change as called out on the superseded EO, along with the reason for the change of the superseding EO.

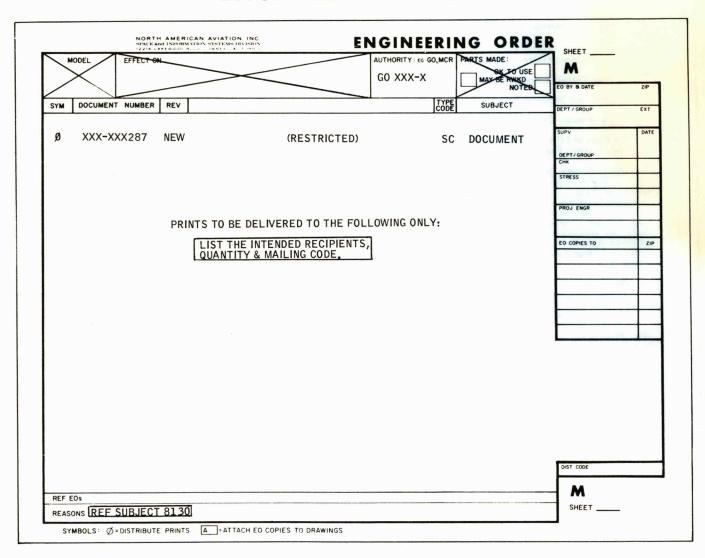
Should it become necessary to cancel all of the information on a given EO sheet, the sheet will be superseded as described above except that the supersedure note entered in the body of the superseding sheet will read "This sheet supersedes sheet (sheet number and supersedure letter, if any) of EO XXXXXX in that all information is canceled, and the drawing is returned to its original state." (Add disposition of parts made.) When superseding (sheet-for-sheet) all sheets, a new EO number shall be used. Cancelation of a multi-sheet EO cancels all sheets and is accomplished by the preparation of a single sheet cancellation EO using an unrelated EO number and indicating in the body of the cancelling EO that "This EO cancels EO XXXXXX (sheets X through Y) in its entirety and restores the drawing to its original state." When cancelling a multi-sheet "Change" EO, the "subject" of the cancelling EO is "CHANGE." A copy of all sheets of a multi-sheet EO (which have not been superseded) shall accompany the cancelling EO through the release system. Figure 4.2b illustrates multi-sheet EO numbering system.





5. SPECIAL DISTRIBUTION. RESTRICTED DISTRIBUTION is a subnormal distribution of prints of drawings that are of value to only a limited number of individuals or departments and may be effected by using the word "RESTRICTED" in parentheses in front of the EO subject entered in the "Subject" Column (see Figure 5) of the releasing EO. The "MODEL & EFFECTIVITY" block and the "PARTS MADE" block are crossed out. All EO's indicating restricted distribution are "SC" type. The EO body will contain a list of intended recipients under the note "PRINTS TO BE DELIVERED TO THE FOLLOWING ONLY." Change EO's may be written against a drawing which has been given RESTRICTED distribution; however, these EO's will carry the distribution note and the list of recipients as shown on the previous EO. RESTRICTED drawings may be obsoleted when necessary. The list of recipients will be the same as on previous EO's but will appear in the "COPIES TO" block of the EO. It is necessary that drawings be removed from the "RESTRICTED" category when parts are to be made. This shall be accomplished by a non-restricted (norma!) drawing release under the next sequential change-letter. The following note shall be the first entry in the drawing Revision block: "NC DRAWING (or "A" CHANGE DRAWING) WAS RESTRICTED." The restricted distribution list shown on the last previous releasing EO shall be duplicated on the new releasing EO but will be shown in the "Copies To" block only.

6. SECURITY CLASSIFICATION NOTES. If a Security Classification is required on a drawing, it is specified by the responsible originating Engineering group on the releasing EO. The Release Group will place the security classification along with the Espionage Notation in the appropriate drawing areas as discussed in Subject 7171. The security classification for each classified drawing being released on an EO will be noted in parentheses adjacent to the drawing number and to the right of the "REV" letter column. EO's releasing classified drawings into the normal production release system shall list the intended recipients under the following note: PRINTS TO BE DELIVERED TO THE FOLLOWING ONLY (list recipients and quantity and mailing code.)

- 7. <u>EO TYPES</u>. Engineering Orders are classified by the following types:
 - A. Basic Drawing Release (Type Code BR)
 - B. Design Change Release (Type Code DC)
 - C. Subordinate Document Release (Type Code SD)
 - D. Supplementary Control Release (Type Code SC)

The four types of EO's are to be used as follows (see coordination chart, Figure 7):

A. Basic Drawing Release (Type Code BR) - Release of drawings representing the basic contract end item Detail Specification configuration. Basic Release will only apply to release of new model requirements represented by the indentured drawing list identified in the Basic Release Package as determined by the Program Engineering head. Any subsequent drawing changes or new drawings not identified in the Basic Release Package will be identified as Design Change Type. Basic drawing releases will consist of:

New drawings Changes to existing drawings to add the new model requirements. (Changes may be by direct drawing revision or Change EO.)

Basic Release will normally show effectivity 1 & SUBS. However, the basic contract specification may specify certain CEI serial numbers to contain installations different from other CEI serial numbers. In this case,the release EO for Basic Release will show effectivity other than 1 & SUBS as specified in the basic contract specification.

B. Design Change Release (Type Code DC) - Release of changes to the configuration established by Basic Release. Design change releases will consist of:

New drawing Changes to existing drawings. (Changes may be by direct drawing revision or Change EQ.) C. Subordinate Document Release (Type Code SD) - Release of documents which are subordinate to the model configuration drawings and are activated by callout on the model configuration drawings. The entry in the Effect On block of releasing EO's normally will be "Release to Files." If there is a necessity for limiting effectivity of Subordinate Documents to specific serial numbers of a model, the EO "Effect On" block must specify such effectivity in accordance with the normal rules regarding interchangeability. Subordinate Document releases will consist of:

Process specifications Procurement specifications Standard drawings Material specifications Wiring diagrams Schematics Specification control drawings

Note: In some instances a specification control drawing may be a contract end item itself; therefore, would have no using drawing. In these cases, the type would be BR for initial release or DC in event of design changes.

D. Supplementary Control Releases (Type Code SC) Releases which do not establish a model design
configuration. Supplementary control releases will consist of:

Stop Order and Stop Order Release

Rework Information

Misc. Documents (ICD's, QC Spec., etc.)

Quotation Request and Purchase Request Test/Development Requirements

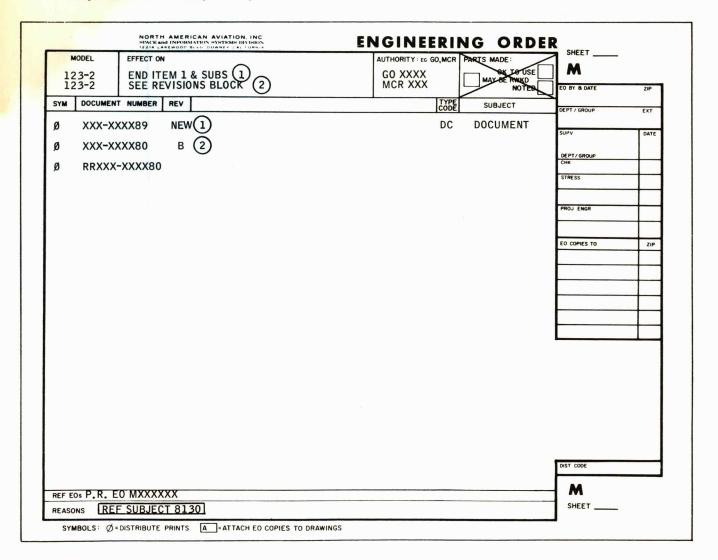
When a "Document" subject EO is used to release a changed drawing which adds initial requirements for an additional model, the body of the EO shall note:

"INITIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR MODEL XXX-X"

8.1.2 When a "Document" subject EO is used to release new production requirements for a document previously used only for test, the body of the EO shall note:

"INITIAL RELEASE - PREVIOUSLY RELEASED FOR TEST ONLY"

If previously fabricated test parts are acceptable for production, their use must be authorized on the EO by a note.



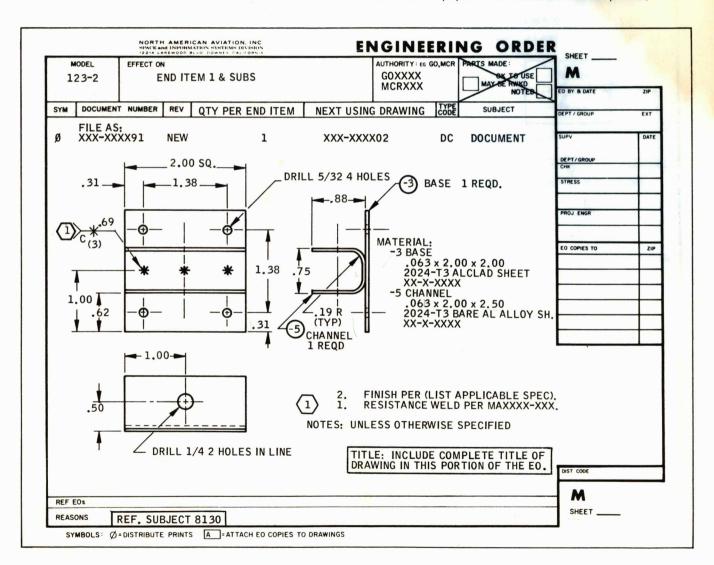
8.1.3 This subject is also used when parts are drawn on the EO format in advance of being prepared on the conventional drawing format. The released EO is then established as the working drawing until the conventional drawing is released. This "EO drawing" shall only be used when schedules preclude the use of the conventional drawing methods. It should not be used to release parts which can be detailed in the conventional manner with equal effort. This method of release may only be used if all the required information is contained on a single sheet EO. It shall not be combined with any other document or subject. The conventional drawing shall be prepared and released within 30 days from the date of release of the EO drawing. The body of the EO drawing shall specify as the first entry the note:

"FILE AS XXX-XXXXXX"

The drawing title shall be specified in the lower right hand corner of the EO. The number required per end item, next using drawing, and all the necessary information to completely fabricate the part shall be specified (see Figure 8.1.3). An EO drawing shall not be changed or superseded. However, it may be canceled without making the conventional drawing. When a change is required, the conventional drawing shall be made and released incorporating the changes. When a conventional drawing is established from an EO drawing, without changes, the "A" change revision block of the drawing will carry the following note:

REDRAWN WITHOUT CHANGES - WAS ED MXXXXXX

When a conventional drawing is established with changes, a Revision Record shall be prepared in accordance with standard practice.



CHANGE. To be used when effecting a change against an 8.2 Engineering document. A design change EO is always written against a document and it is considered as an outstanding change to the document on release. It shall be indicated as "attached to" (A) the document and will be incorporated into the vellum at the next revision (see Figure 8.2a and 8.2b). The one exception to this procedure is a change EO used to establish initial requirements for an existing part used on an additional model (part by number) when no other drawing revisions are being made; this EO will not be attached but will be incorporated into the vellum at the next revision.

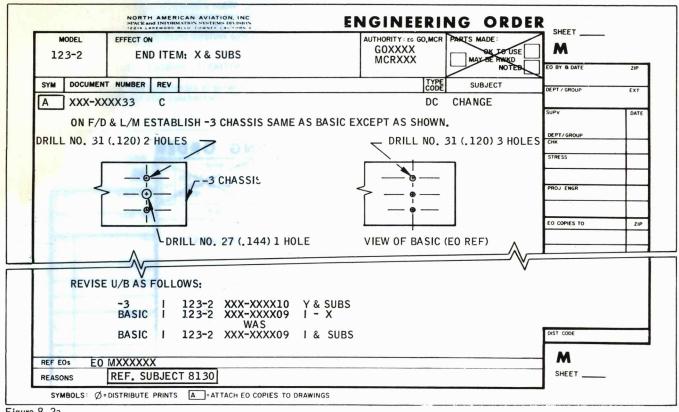
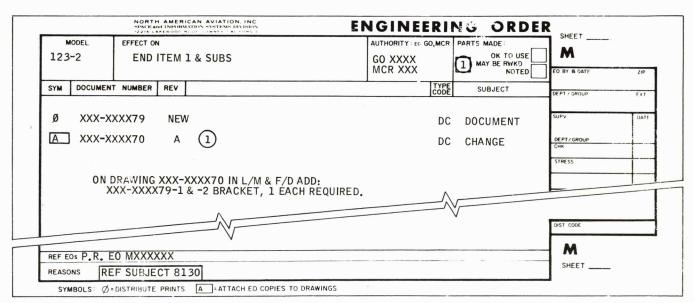

- 8.2.1 A change EO that is used to establish the initial requirements for an existing part for a new model (part by number) shall list the NAA parts individually with the applicable identifying dash numbers of right-hand, left-hand, or tabulated-type parts as might be necessary. The quantity required per end item and the next using drawing for each entry shall be indicated. The model block shall show only the model for which the part is being released. The current revision letter should be omitted (see Figure 8.2.1).
- 8.2.2 When it is necessary to cancel a previously released (but not yet incorporated) "change" EO, a new "change" subject EO shall be written cancelling the entire contents of the previously released EO (see Figure 8.2.2). The effectivity of the new change EO must be identical to the effectivity of the previously released change EO to be canceled. A note on the new change EO should state that the old EO is to be canceled and shall indicate the disposition of parts made, e.g.,

"This EO cancels EO MXXXXXXX (give sheet dash numbers if multi-sheet EO, e.g., sheet 1 thru 4) and returns drawing to its original state. Parts made to EO MXXXXXX may be reworked."

(Rework information is furnished on separate EO when required.)

When the canceled EO added newly created captive dash-numbered components to a drawing, then the cancelling EO shall give specific instructions to add the newly created dash numbers to the drawing L/M and "line-thru" to indicate it is not to be used (see Subject 7430). If the to-be- canceled EO removed dash-numbered components, then the cancelling EO shall give specific instructions as to reinstatement of drawing to its original configuration.

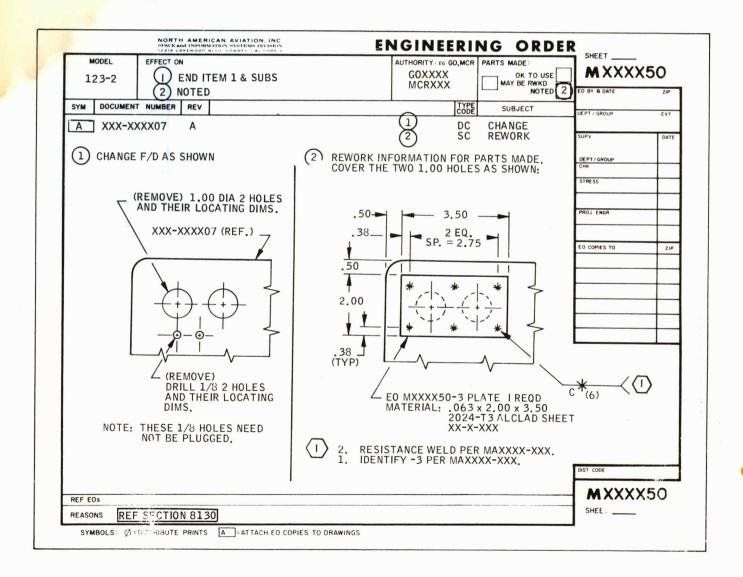

8.3 REWORK. To be used when it is necessary to furnish special instructions as follows:

(A) When information is required to use parts which have been made prior to, or concurrent with, a drawing change (or a previously released change EO) but cannot be reworked to be identical to the revised drawing (see Figure 8. 3a) and, (B) When information is required to fabricate, assemble, install, test, etc., components NOT like the Engineering drawing (see Figures 8. 3b and 8. 3c). Note: This subject cannot be used to salvage parts not made per a drawing due to a manufacturing error. This subject shall always be used with the SC type of EO. Any special parts or assemblies required to support this rework EO or any parts that are fabricated differently than the Engineering Drawing will be depicted on the EO and assigned EO dash number for identification. A specific effectivity should be given, if known. Rework subject EO's shall not indicate the "Attach To" symbol (A).

- 8.4.1 "CANCELLATION" is to be used when "obsoleting" a drawing. A drawing shall not be obsoleted if it is applicable to any items delivered to the customer. The drawing original shall accompany the EO through the Release system to the Release Desk. Release Desk will mark the drawing "obsolete," record the data on the release card, and send it to the vellum vault. Engineering shall see that action is taken to remove all reference to the obsoleted drawing. The removal from the next assembly drawing shall be accomplished simultaneously with the obsoletion. The statement: "REMOVE ALL PRINTS FROM ALL FILES AND DESTROY" shall be contained in the body of the EO. A drawing, once obsoleted, may be reinstated when circumstances require its use. Outstanding EO's will never be incorporated against an obsoleted drawing until such time as the drawing is reinstated. (See Figure 8.4.1).

- 8.4.2 "CANCELLATION" shall also be used when the entire contents of a previously released EO (other than a change EO) are to be canceled (see Figure 8.4.2). The effectivity shall be identical to the EO which is being canceled. Adequate notes shall be used to direct disposition of those parts made. An EO that released new or changed drawings may not be canceled nor may an EO that has been incorporated into a drawing be canceled. A copy of the canceled EO will accompany the canceling EO through the release system. When the entire contents of a "change" EO are to be canceled, the EO requirements shall be as described in paragraph 8.2.2.
- 8.4.3 When it is necessary to cancel a portion of the requirements ordered on an EO that establishes initial requirements for an existing part used on a new model (part by number), the cancellation EO will be prepared as illustrated in Figure 8.4.3. It should be noted that this kind of EO cancels all quantity requirements for a given part ordered on the previous EO (when it is necessary to change "quantities" a supersedure EO shall be used). Except for this kind of EO, a CANCELLATION EO cancels another EO in its entirety.

8.5 STOP ORDER. To be used when it is necessary to stop fabrication and/or installation of previously released parts. This subject shall always be used with the SC type EO. The part numbers of all parts which are to be stopped shall be listed. A Stop Order which lists an assembly number only will not stop work on any of the NAA part-numbered components of that assembly whether or not the components are detailed on separate drawings or are dashnumbered details of the assembly drawing. The effectivity of the stoppage for the NAA parts is to be indicated by production end item numbers. A note shall always appear specifying the purchasing action required as a result of the stop order, such as: "Procurement not affected" or "Stop Procurement." Special care should be taken on castings and forgings to indicate if the rough casting or forging is to be stopped. In the event a status report is required, the EO should so indicate either as a planning note (for NAA fabricated parts) or as a purchasing note (for outside parts). Stop Order EO's shall always specify the date of the estimated release from Engineering (see Figure 8.5). Stop Order EO's shall not be superseded, canceled, nor combined with any other subject. When a Stop Order is considered as not required after it is issued, then it shall be removed by a "Stop Order release" EO. If any (or all) of the information contained on a Stop Order EO is to be modified, the Stop Order shall be removed by a Stop Order Release EO and a new Stop Order sol issued incorporating the changes that made the action necessary.

8.6 STOP ORDER RELEASE. To be used when releasing parts previously stopped by a Stop Order. This subject shall be used with the "SC" type EO. Stop Order Release may be used to remove all or part of an item (or items) from a Stop Order. A note on the EO should indicate if the Stop Order is being released in full or in part (see Figure 8.6). It is desirable at times to combine a Stop Order Release with another "subject," such as: Cancellation, Change, Document, etc. The EO shall provide complete information for the disposition of those parts for which the Stop Order is to be lifted without design change to the stopped part. The drawing number and its current change letter shall be indicated. A copy of the Stop Order EO shall always accompany a Stop Order Release EO through the release system.

- 8.7 $\frac{\text{QUOTATION REQUEST.}}{\text{quotation from Purchasing.}} \text{ To be used when requesting a quotation from Purchasing.} \text{ This subject shall always be used with the "SC" type EO (see EOM).}$
- 8.8 PURCHASE REQUEST. To be used to authorize procurement in advance of the drawing release. This subject shall always be used with the "SC" type EO (see EOM).

- 8.9 EO SUPERSEDURE
- 8.9.1 When it becomes necessary to supersede information contained in a previously released EO that has not been incorporated into the drawing, the following method shall be used:

 Form M153-K will be used for superseding a single sheet EO. In effect, the new EO cancels all of the previously released information contained on the superseded EO and replaces it with the revised information, thus becoming the outstanding EO against the drawing. Additional new information shown on the superseding EO shall be restricted to that which made the supersedure of the EO necessary. Therefore, any other additional information which can be released separately shall not be added to the revised EO unless its separate release would violate the rule that an EO shall not conflict with information shown on another EO and cannot depend on information shown on a previously released EO. This type of EO shall not be combined with any subjects other than those that were already combined with the original EO. A copy of the superseded EO shall accompany the superseding EO through the Release system.
- 8.9.2 The EO "type" and "subject" shall be the same as the EO that is being superseded. The upper portion of the field of the superseding EO shall contain an introductory paragraph which will begin as follows:

"SUPERSEDES EO MXXXXXX AND DIFFERS AS FOLLOWS":

The difference between the superseding EO and the superseded EO shall then be described. The introductory paragraph shall also contain a disposition for parts made to the superseded EO similar to the following:

"PARTS MADE PER EO MXXXXXX TO BE REWORKED"

"THE SUPERSEDING PORTION OF THIS EO DOES NOT AFFECT PARTS MADE"

(or)

"PARTS MADE PER EO MXXXXXXX OK TO USE"

Following this introductory paragraph, a line shall be drawn across the body of the EO to separate this information from the correct information which shall be carried from the previous EO, except as modified and described in the introductory paragraph. The "REASONS" block of the superseding EO shall repeat the "reasons" shown on the superseded EO along with the reason for the superseding EO. The superseding EO will be completed giving the revised, added, removed, and all correct information except:

- The Ø symbol will not be used (a)
- If the superseded EO superseded another EO, the (b) latter's introductory paragraph will not be shown on the new EO.

8.9.3 If the superseded EO contained any EO dash-numbered parts, information will have to be given on the superseding EO defining the reidentification of those parts made as well as any rework that may be required. For example:

"EO MXXXXX7-3 MAY BE MADE FROM EO MXXXXX8-3"

"EO MXXXXX8-1 MAY BE MADE FROM EO MXXXXX4-1 BY REIDENTIFICATION ONLY"

EO information which has been incorporated into a drawing cannot be revised or canceled by this kind of EO.

9. LIMITED RELEASE. An EO releasing a new drawing may release its parts for a limited quantity of end items by designating the end items in the EO "Effect On" block and using the word LIMITED parenthetically in the EO "Effect On" block. However, the drawing's Application (Usage) Data block will not agree with the EO "Effect On" block, i.e., it will reflect the end item effectivity required by its next assembly usage. The drawing shall not be serial number coded to agree with the EO "Effect On" block (see Figure 9).

- 9.1 Change EO's written against drawings which are on a limited status shall carry the word LIMITED parenthet—ically in the EO "Effect On" block, and will, if rework is required, be effective on the limited end items only.
- 9.2 The limited status may be maintained when releasing a changed drawing by using the word LIMITED parenthetically in the EO "Effect On" block of the releasing EO. The effect on the rework called for in the drawing Revisions Record shall be limited end items.
- 9.3 The limited status shall be subsequently removed. This shall be accomplished by releasing a changed drawing. The following note shall be the first entry in the Drawing Revisions Record:

NC DRAWING (or "A" CHANGE DWG) WAS LIMITED RELEASED FOR END ITEMS X THRU Y ONLY

Following the note, revision items will be listed and if rework is indicated, the effectivity will no longer be the limited end items. The "Effect On" block of the EO releasing such a drawing shall show SEE REVISIONS BLOCK. A note similar to the following shall be entered in the body of the EO:

THIS EO REMOVES LIMITED RELEASE STATUS EFFECT ON 1 & SUBS WAS 1 THRU 2 ONLY

- 9.4 When a limited released drawing is to be obsoleted, the word "LIMITED" shall not be used in the EO "Effect On" block. The effectivity shown on the obsoleting EO shall be the current limited end items. LIMITED releases shall not be combined with RESTRICTED distribution or NORMAL releases.
- TEST AND DEVELOPMENT
- 10.1 A test and development type part as referenced herein is a part or assembly which is fabricated for the sole purpose of performing a functional or structural test. The instructions herein do not apply to testing of production parts or to the testing of suppliers off-the-shelf proprietary items. The provisions of the foregoing paragraphs shall apply towards EO preparation in addition to the following.
- Only the word "TEST" will appear in the "Effect On" block of the EO. No model number will appear in the model block of the EO. All EO's involving test/development requirements are "SC" type EO's and the EO "SUBJECTS" are the same as would be applicable to production parts (except for additional quantities needed for new test requirements wherein the subject is "TEST/DEV"). (See Figure 10.2.)

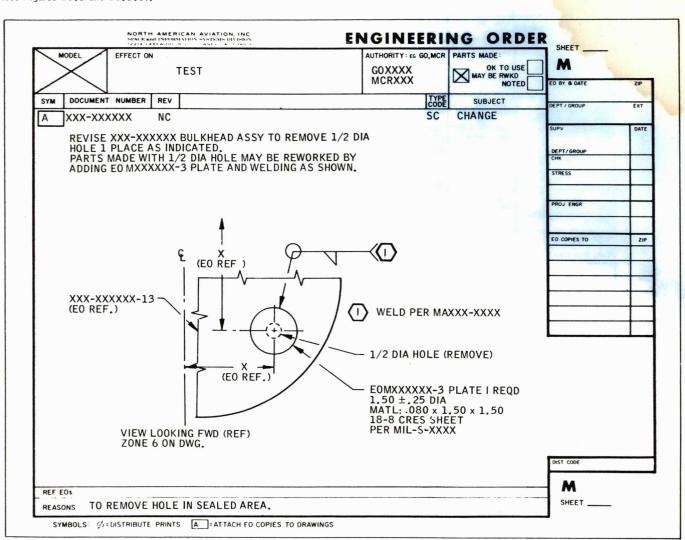

For those parts not further assembled or installed, the "NEXT USING DRAWING" column of the EO will indicate "TEST" (see Figure 10.3).

- 10.3.1 When all, or part, of the components of an assembly are required, a note may appear on the EO such as: "THIS EO RELEASES DRAWING XXXX-XXXXX AND ALL SUBORDINATE PARTS," (or) "........ ALL SUBORDINATE PARTS EXCEPT......" (list the exceptions). This method eliminates the necessity of listing all subs; however, partial assemblies will be assigned EO dash numbers for identification purposes.
- 10.3.2 Any special instructions or deviations required shall be specified in a note on the face of the EO, e.g., "NO INSPECTION REQUIRED" or "NO PLATING REQUIRED."
- 10.3.3 Those parts or assemblies that are fabricated differently from those described on the drawing will require assignment of an EO dash number for identification and shall be labeled "For Testing Purposes Only." Completion date and delivery information including information on parts to be furnished by Engineering (Engineer's name and extension) will appear in the body of the EO (see Figures 10.3 and 10.3.3).
- 10.4 Parts required for test/development usage as depicted on production drawings may be ordered as noted above.

 Test/development requirements shall not be reflected in the U/B of production drawings.
- 10.4.1 When test drawings are to be released for the fabrication of production parts, all desirable design changes and EO's shall be incorporated into the drawing and the U/B revised to remove the test requirements and add the production requirements. The drawing shall be released for production as a changed document under the next applicable change letter.
- 10.4.2 If completed test parts are acceptable as production parts, the production release EO should so state in addition to indicating where the test parts may be obtained. The parts will receive normal processing, inspection, etc.
