HE HAS dug into history to make history. His first book Congress Secret Broadcast and Storming Railway Tracks during Quit India Movement created a flutter, so did his phamplets on road safety.

A script writer and researcher with Indira Gandhi National Centre for Art (IGNCA), Dr Gautam Chatterjee's creative instinct has helped him to present complex thoughts through simple ideas.

While doing a course, Archival Diploma of Record Management at the National Archives of India, Chatterjee had access to IB documents, and soon it took the form of a book, his first.
