1. The purpose of the present Table is
 - a. To provide a compact and readily intelligible overall view of the United States Fleet.
 - (1) Before the onset of war,
 - (2) At the end of the war,
 - (3) At the present time, and
 - (4) As presently being built for the future, and
 - b. To present a summary of the changes which have taken place in the United States Fleet, documented by the names or hull numbers of the vessels whose status has changed.
2. The maintenance of a balance sheet on the United States Fleet has become a very complex undertaking. Vessels have been built, purchased, chartered, converted and transferred to friendly powers in accordance with the dictates of operational needs and under a great variety of legal authorizations and types of contracts. In order to present a simplified statement of Fleet strength it is necessary to disregard many technicalities of vessel status. Thus, in this table, "Commissioned" vessels include not only those which have formally received their commissions, but also those others which have entered the naval service simply as "chartered" ships or "placed in service" craft, but they do not include those vessels which have been transferred to friendly powers within six months of the time when they were first commissioned. Similarly, vessels being converted for naval service are included with newly designed men-of-war under the general heading "Under Construction", but no ship is included in this category which is not actually, at the present time, being built or prepared for service with the United States Fleet.
3. It is recognized that errors are inevitable in so broad a summary as that here-with presented. Corrections and emendations will be welcomed.
