



## **ibiblio.org in less than one page, but more than two paragraphs**

ibiblio.org, which began its life as sunsite.unc.edu in 1992, is a contributor-run digital library and archive serving the world. Although ibiblio began as a way to share and support all kinds of free software, we now host over 1500 non-software related projects on almost every conceivable subject -- a few even surprise us. From Project Gutenberg (the famous free book archive) to etree.org (where fans of tape friendly bands share concert music), from charities and non-profits both local to North Carolina and international (especially those of the Tibetan government in exile) to video documentaries of folk practice, from educational sites to those of odd amusements, ibiblio.org serves over 10 million requests for information per day.

Besides web-based services, ibiblio.org is involved in Internet 2 projects, 3-D environments, video archiving, supporting NASA educational video and in the streaming of six not-for-profit radio station. ibiblio.org is also involved in free software development directly with several local projects as well as leadership in the Linux Documentation Project.

ibiblio.org is staffed by two full time employees, up to 8 students working part time, and one faculty member only part of whose time is dedicated to the project (on paper at least).
