Example: In the poem *Dreams Deferred*, the poet uses metaphor, and he uses alliteration.

1. Langston Hughes lived before the civil rights movement so he knew what problems African-Americans faced.

2. He wrote many poems but one of his most famous is Dreams Deferred.

3. In this poem he asks questions about what frustrated people might do and he gives several examples.

4. He says some dreams will basically rot but some will explode into violence – or oblivion.

5. Another of his famous poems is along the same line but it is called simply Dreams.

6. In *Dreams* Hughes compares lost dreams to fields and he also compares them to hurt birds.

7. Perhaps one of his most powerful poems is *Sympathy* but it is also harder to understand.

8. Maya Angelou took the first line of *Sympathy* and she used it for her book, titled <u>I Know Why</u> the Caged Bird Sings.

9. Interestingly enough, Lorraine Hainsbury also took a line from a Hughes poem but she used it to entitle a play - <u>A Raisin in the Sun</u>.

10. Encourage others to read these classic literary works, or encourage them to explore other Langston Hughes poems.

1. Langston Hughes Maya Angelou Lorraine Hainsbury - these are all famous American writers.

2. Besides these African-American writers, the United States has many other world renowned authors.

3. Edgar Allan Poe the father of the mystery story has fans around the world.
