There are 70,000 different woods known to man, less than 400 commercially available and approximately 269 are pictured in color in *World Woods in Color* by William A. Lincoln. It was highly recommended in a wood class I took recently. The commercial names, distribution, general description, mechanical properties, seasoning, working properties, durability and uses for each wood are listed.
