Tuesday February 19 Meeting

Curved doors with a veneered surface

Steve Bodner, who is retired and lives near Pittsboro, will describe how to build curved plywood doors with veneered surfaces, such as he used in this Federal-style sideboard.



There are four methods of making doors with significant curvature. Coopering or laminating is used with solid doors; bricklaying or plywood is used as a base for veneered doors. Host: Bill Anderson

Kaleidoscope Construction Workshop



During this 2 day workshop, March 29th and 30th, Jim Duxbury will instruct and guide each participant in the construction of his own Intermediate model wooden kaleidoscope. This

kaleidoscope is a typical example of a traditional 3-mirror scope with an oil-filled object box and prisms exterior lens contained in a rotatable end cylinder.

Participants will fabricate one of Jim's unique cone jigs for turning the centerless kaleidoscope barrel and end cylinder. This technique can also be used to turn numerous other centerless objects. Each person will make all the pieces for the object box, cut glass for the eyepiece, and also cut the first surface mirror using a mirror-cutting jig.

This kaleidoscope is Not a Kit – everything is fabricated and then assembled.

Instruction Cost = \$120.00 (\$60.00/day)

Materials Cost = 65.00

Total = \$185.00

1. Basic techniques of woodturning are essential. *
2. Class must have 6 but no more than 8 paid participants.
3. Class will meet at Leland Studios. 6325 Kinard Road, Durham, NC
4. Bring your own lunch. Coffee, soft drinks and bottled water provided.
5. Two 7-hour sessions. (Approx. 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. with 1 hour lunch break)
6. Bring your own turning tools if you have them. Limited tools provided.
7. Instruction Cost (Includes Handouts, Plans, and use of Equipment & Facilities)
8. Material Cost (Includes Pre-cut Wood, Mirror & Glass, PVC couplings, Plexiglas, Screws, Washers, Epoxy, E-6000 Glue, Sandpaper, Deft, Glycerin, Objects, 3 -3" Radiator Clamps, and Band-Aids)

Participants should bring the following to workshop:

Safety Glasses or Face shield
Duct Tape
Masking Tape
Yellow Wood Glue
Ruler, Pencil & Paper
Compass & Calipers (if you have them)
Digital Camera (if you want to take photos)

* For those interested in the workshop but who do not have basic lathe experience Alan Leland offers wood turning classes at a reasonable cost. Alan's woodturning classes are available at his studio, at Klingspor Woodworking Shop and at the New Woodcraft store although he prefers to teach in his studio. Alan can teach evening classes that run from 6 to 9pm and all day classes on weekdays preferably but he does still have a few weekends open between now and the end of March. Classes are designed for from one to three students (he prefers to teach three students) the evening classes cost \$40 to \$45 and the day long classes range from \$80 to \$95 depending upon the number of students and the materials used. 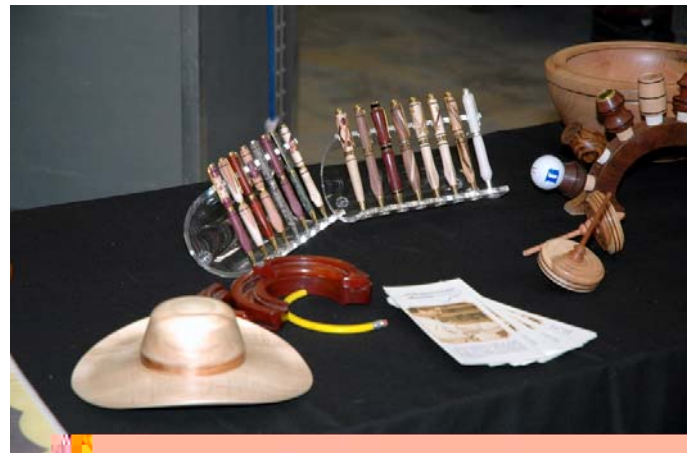
