Technically, the N&Opedia is a wiki, which is simply a set of interconnected webpages that are easy to edit. Everyone is encouraged to add information or to make changes. If you are uncertain or want a helping hand, don't hesitate to contact [News Research](#) .

A Few Wiki Tips

- [Please register and log in if you haven't already.](#)  It's quick and easy. To keep it simple we suggest using your email address (for example, *jdoe*).
- Wikis are completely editable by everyone! If you see that a page is missing information or has an error, you can edit it (as long as you are logged in). Use the "edit" tab at the top of the page you are on. You can preview the changes before saving, or use the "cancel" button to exit from edit mode without saving.
- For more help in making page changes, such as adding bullets, adding links, and more, see [How to edit a page](#) .
- A good way to experiment with editing is to visit the [Sandbox](#).
- Most information in a Wiki is found via the search. For example, try to search for the word, 'ncsu' (without quotes).
- Once you've found a document, if you see that it is missing information or has an error, you can edit it (as long as you are logged in).

In this area the newsroom can keep up with documents and information retrieved while working on breaking news or ongoing news stories.

Wakefield High Students Killed

On Saturday night, 3/4/2006, four Wakefield High School students, Baker Sterling Wood, Steven George and Timothy Steinberg, all of whom were 18, and Anthony Bostic, 17, were killed in a car accident on the newly opened U.S. 64/264 Bypass.

Mohammed Reza Taheri-azar

On Friday, 3/3/2006, Mohammed Reza Taheri-azar drove an SUV onto the UNC campus and into a crowd of people mingling in "the pit." Nine people were hit. No one was killed. Taheri-azar faces nine charges of attempted first-degree murder, as well as other charges.

Monique and Paul Berkley

On 12/18/2005 Paul Berkley was shot and killed in Millbrook Exchange Park in Raleigh. His wife, Monique Berkley, although also shot, was eventually linked to the murder.

Experts Database

- Who knows what in the newsroom
- Examples: foreign languages, hobbies, places you've lived, etc.

Contest list

- What we usually enter
- Listing of deadlines
- Links to contest home pages

Newsroom Experts

The Newsroom Experts page is a place to find colleagues who are knowledgeable -- even expert -- on particular topics. The page is also useful for finding people who might have special information on a topic. For example, a UNC graduate from 2000 might be able to show you the chancellor's signature from a diploma.

What to do on the Experts pages

At this point you can take one of two actions:

1. Add your name to a page

- Click on a link, then choose the "edit" tab at the top. Note: You must be logged in to edit.
- When the edit window appears add your name to the list.
- Save the page.

2. View a page to find people with knowledge about a particular topic

- Click on a link to find those who are "in the know" on that topic.

Remember, you can use your browser's "find" function (ctrl-F or apple-F) to find a word or sentence on the page.

Note that if a link is red then the page is blank. Click on the link and be the first to add your name!

What Has Worked



- Breaking news!
- Training to learn to edit the wiki
- Logging in to edit
 - Some concerns about security of the information on a page.
 - Wiki also has ability to go back to a previous version of a page.

What Has Not Worked



- Some reluctance to edit a page
 - Researchers are editing
- Long pages of text
 - Page formatting is key
 - Bullets, sections, indentation, tables, etc.
 - But it makes editing more complicated
- Sometimes news happens too fast

Other Struggles



- Wiki Installation
 - Had to get I.S. involved
- Wiki Customization
 - Left side bar can be changed
 - Managed to take off “Donate Money” link
 - Added a “Sandbox” link
 - Added the N&Omedia logo
- Documentation is good, but it’s not always easy to find what you are looking for.
