The guard will be detailed daily and will consist of one Officer of the Day, One (1) Sergeant of the Guard, Two (2) Corporals and nine enlisted men.


The Officer of the Day and Sergeant of the Guard will be detailed from a roster kept by Battalion Headquarters of the 1st Signal Construction Battalion.

Guard will be posted at 6:00 PM daily and will be dismissed at 6:00 AM the following day.

The Officer of the Day will report to the Commanding Officer of the 1st Signal Construction Battalion at 11,000 AM on the day that he is detailed as Officer of the Day and will be relieved by the new Officer of the Day at 11:00 AM on the following day.

SUBJECT: History of 27th Signal Construction Battalion for year 1943.

TO: The Adjutant General, War Department, Washington D. C. (Thru Channels)

- 1. In accordance with paragraph 11 b, AR 345-105, the following historical record of the 27th Signal Construction Battalion, for the year ending 31 December 1945, is submitted. A negative report is rendered in regards to the information called for by paragraphs g-h, inclusive of paragraph 15, AR 345-105.
 - a. Original Unit:
 - (1) Designation: Originally 1st Signal Construction Battalion, later changed to 27th Signal Construction Battalion.
 - (2) Date of Organization: 21 May 1941.
 - (3) Place of Organization: Camp Bowie, Texas.
 - (4) Authority for Organization: General Order, Headquarters Camp Bowie, Texas.
 - (5) Sources from which personnel were obtained: By transfer, from other units, voluntary enlistment and draft.
 - b. Changes in Organization:
 - (1) Name was changed from "1st Signal Construction Battalion" to "27th Signal Construction Battalion".
 - (2) On 24 January 1942, all personnel except a cadre of 5 Officers and 44 Enlisted Men were transferred to 456th Signal Construction Battalion (AVN). Newly drafted personnel were received from reception center's.
 - c. Strength, Commissioned and Enlisted.

On Deptember 1 the strength of this organisation had changed to 19 officers and 458 emisted men. On May I the strength had increased to 5 officers and 546 enlisted men. This increase in strength was due to the influx of over 400 recruits from Colorado, Oklahoma, Fewns and New Mexico.

Mester tebedules and weekly braining schedules were drawn up for laweeks of basic training.

Classes were conducted for clerks, cooks, drivers, mechanics, dreftsmen, cable splicers, TF & TO linears, and Prospective Noncommissioned Officers.

On May 19, 1942, Major MICHOLLO was transferred from the Battelion by Faragraph 3, Special Order 131, Headquarters Highth Corps Area, and Captain LOSALY N. MAGNA was assigned to the Dattalion on the same order. Captain MOGNA assumed command of the gattelion.



FRENCH POWER CONSERVATION PROGRAM: Due to the effect of low temperatures resulting in decrease of water for electric power generation the French Government has put in effect a curtailment of power supply throughout France which will involve the disconnection from the main power feeders of certain distribution circuits for a total of approximately 6-8 hours per day, this being divided between a morning and afternoon cutoff period. The French Government has no intention of interrupting the supply of electric power needed for Army and/or war industries requirements supplying Army. The enforcement of the French Government curtailment plan will be effected through the numerous local power companies throughout the country, to each of which has been given the responsibility for effecting a certain reduction in consumption, and at the same time to each of which has been given the instructions that Army requirements will not be cut off. The plan as made should not have any effect on power needs for any of the Army services. However, since many small companies will be handling the matter it is entirely possible that through error some installation of some service might find itself without power during the morning and afternoon periods. In any case where this occurs the service should immediately notify the Engineer, this headquarters. There is no central control of electric power throughout the entire CAS Area. However, through contacts with the power companies it is believed that any accidental cut-off resulting in power shortage to a service can be promptly corrected. Before reporting shutoffs to the Engineer, unit commanders will ascertain insofar as possible whether the shut-off is created by the power conservation program, or if it is merely a temporary line failure.
